SUBJECT: ANNUAL ASSESSMENT LETTER - VOGTLE ELECTRIC GENERATING PLANT
(NRC INSPECTION REPORT 05000424/2007001 AND 05000425/2007001)

Dear Mr. Tynan:

On February 6, 2007, the NRC staff completed its performance review of the Vogtle Electric Generating Plant. Our technical staff reviewed performance indicators (PIs) for the most recent quarter and inspection results for the period from January 1 through December 31, 2006. The purpose of this letter is to inform you of our assessment of your safety performance during this period and our plans for future inspections at your facility.

This performance review and enclosed inspection plan do not include physical protection information. A separate letter designated and marked as "Exempt from Public Disclosure in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390" will include the physical protection review and resultant inspection plan.

Overall, Vogtle Units 1 and 2 operated in a manner that preserved public health and safety and fully met all cornerstone objectives. Plant performance for the most recent quarter was within the Regulatory Response column of the NRC's Action Matrix based on a White inspection finding in the Emergency Preparedness (EP) cornerstone and the Unit 2 Mitigating Systems Performance Index (MSPI) for Cooling Water Systems crossing the White threshold. The EP inspection finding was for the failure of the critique process to identify a weakness associated with a risk-significant planning standard that was determined to be a Drill/Exercise Performance Indicator opportunity failure during the full-scale exercise and was identified in the third quarter. The Unit 2 MSPI for Cooling Water Systems crossed the White threshold in the third quarter due to multiple failures of a single Nuclear Service Cooling Water train.

We were notified by your staff of your readiness for the NRC to conduct a supplemental inspection to review the actions taken to address the White MSPI for Cooling Water Systems. Therefore, we plan to conduct a supplemental inspection, using Inspection Procedure (IP) 95001, beginning on May 14, 2007.

You have appealed the EP finding and our review of your final appeal is not yet complete. We will schedule a date to conduct a supplemental inspection, using IP 95001, once we are informed you are prepared for this inspection.

The enclosed inspection plan details the inspections, less those related to physical protection, scheduled through September 30, 2008. The inspection plan is provided to allow for the resolution of any scheduling conflicts and personnel availability issues well in advance of inspector arrival onsite. In addition to routine baseline inspections, we will also be performing inspections of reactor vessel head and head penetrations, Unit 2 containment emergency recirculation sump modifications, and license renewal activities. Additionally, initial reactor operator licensing examinations are scheduled. Routine resident inspections are not listed due to their ongoing and continuous nature. The inspections in the last twelve months of the inspection plan are tentative and may be revised at the mid-cycle review.
