Dear Nuclear Regulatory Commission:

Thank you for your recent response to my request for a review/study of the use of toxic and hazardous substances in residential and commercial facilities through transmodal and other methods. Specifically, the use of chemicals and gases through systems of ventilation and air.

While I appreciate your recommendation to contact the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), this Commission is a more appropriate venue to address these matters. Initially, I filed the complaint with this agency due to residential side effects experienced from chemicals and gases. The side effects include sleep inducing effects, headaches, nausea, stomach cramping, and physiological warming.

It is unclear whether employment, employment applications, or related activities, are the primary contributing factor. These side effects are experienced frequently and can be immobilizing. Requests were made before the local utility company, the senior vice president of customer affairs, general counsel, and the utility company's board, to review this matter. The board has not followed up on the complaint; however, I still experience the above-described symptoms.

My last request was not specific, in that I did not specifically ask the Commission to do other than a study and review of the purpose and usage of such chemicals. It was my assumption that the Commission would include a contact of local agencies, and a governance of utility and other companies, in its' review and study. It was not my expectation that I would be referred to the EPA; an agency that regulates the disposal of toxic substances.

Again, I appreciate the Commission's recent response. Because these side effects are still experienced, I am filing another complaint and requesting the Commission's attention to this area.

Thanking you in advance for your review and investigation of this matter.

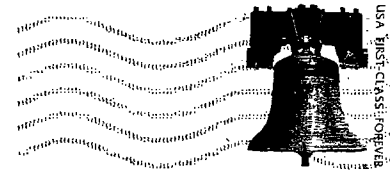
