10. NARRATIVE

On August 18<sup>th</sup> at 1800 hrs. [redacted] NRC employee [redacted] notified Central Alarm station and advised [redacted] shift Supervisor that his credit cards were stolen and he believes that they may have been taken from his work area. Post # 6 [redacted] was dispatched to [redacted] Work area at [redacted] TWFN facility to take a report. Upon arrival at [redacted] work station, I [redacted] was advised by [redacted] that the Credit card company of 3 of his credit cards, notified him of 3 attempted transactions totaling in the following amounts:

1. Bank One USA: \$2120.00....Location of attempt: "BEST BUY" Outlet in GreenBelt MD.
2. Choice visa: \$2099.00.....Location of attempt: "BEST BUY" Outlet in GreenBelt MD.
3. American Express: \$1.00.....Location of attempt: Gas station (name unknown)

[redacted] stated however, that all the transactions were unsuccessful and all the cards were cancelled and re-issued. According to [redacted] the last time he had seen the 3 credit cards was Monday, August 16<sup>th</sup> around 8am. Between the hours of 9am and 10 am, [redacted] claimed that he was in a meeting and when he returned to his work station, he noticed his black, leather, check book, which he keeps all his credit cards, still on his desk, covered in a napkin and seemingly undisturbed along with a cup of coffee and a bagel, the same way he left it. According to [redacted] he has not used those credit cards for an extensive period of time and he always kept the checkbook in the trunk of his car with the exception of Mon. August 16<sup>th</sup>. Later that day, he placed the checkbook back in the trunk of his car and was not aware of the credit cards missing until he was notified today, August 18<sup>th</sup> around 1715 hrs., by the credit card companies. No other items, according to [redacted] has been stolen, disturbed or damaged in his work area. At 1900 hrs. FPS operator #11 was notified, however, the FPS operator advised me that since [redacted] will not be in his office this evening, then the call will have to be placed when he returns to work. At 1910 hrs. [redacted] PSB duty officer, was notified and briefed.
