The Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI)¹, on behalf of the nuclear energy industry, is pleased to submit the proposed *Licensed Operator Training Cold Licensing Plan and Knowledge and Ability (K&A) Catalog Revision Process* white paper for your review and comment.

On May 24, 2007, the industry discussed with your staff the new reactor training concepts captured in the enclosed plan and white paper. The industry agreed to develop white papers to put the concepts in writing and further discuss with the staff. We believe the enclosed plans provide a reasonable approach to the licensing of operators for new reactors and the development of the necessary K&A catalogs.

Once you and your staff have had an opportunity to review the enclosed documents, we would like to request a meeting as soon as practical to discuss your comments. We would like to come to a common understanding of the requirements with you before the industry begins submitting combined operating license applications to ensure consistency and to facilitate the review of the applications.


