This refers to your license amendment request. Enclosed with this letter is the amended license removing the facility located at 687 North Church Street, Hazleton, Pennsylvania. In accordance with a telephone conversation between Mr. Samuel Payne, your Radiation Safety Officer, and Ms. Monica Orendi, it is noted that: (i) the close-out survey was performed on the Nuclear Medicine Department located at 687 North Church Street and not on a "remote storage area in the basement of the hospital" as stated in the close-out survey attached to your June 21, 2007 letter; (ii) no iodine-125 brachytherapy seeds were possessed at 687 North Church Street at the time of closure. Your licensed facilities located at 687 North Church Street may be released for unrestricted use.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand and fully implement all the conditions incorporated into the amended license. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region I Office, Licensing Assistance Team, (610) 337-5239, so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required, since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c)(14).
