Notice.


Since proprietary claims as to Item (a) are asserted by Westinghouse
Electric Corporation, those claims are supported by an affidavit signed by
Westinghouse. The affidavit sets forth the basis on which Westinghouse
claims that the information may be withheld from public disclosure by the
Commission, and addresses the considerations listed in 10 CFR Section
2.790(b)(4). Accordingly, it is respectfully requested that Item (a), or in
the alternative such portions of Item (a) as the Commission determines to be
protected by 10 CFR Section 2.790 as proprietary to Westinghouse, be
withheld from public disclosure in accordance with the Commission's

Subject: Information Bearing Westinghouse Copyright Notices

Gentlemen:

By letter dated May 8, 1990, Westinghouse advised the Nuclear Regulatory Commission that work product issued by Westinghouse will contain a copyright notice. Westinghouse granted the NRC limited permission to reproduce copies of such documents for its internal use and for placement in public document rooms. However, Westinghouse did not authorize the NRC to make copies for the personal use of members of the public. We now have been advised that the NRC is having difficulty in the use and treatment of Westinghouse documents because of the restriction which has been placed on their copying. As an interim measure pending resolution of this matter, Westinghouse is willing to allow the NRC to make copies of the Westinghouse copyright documents for members of the public who may request such documents from the NRC, subject to the provisions of this letter.

In addition to the permission granted in our May 8, 1990 letter, Westinghouse hereby grants further authorization to the NRC to copy non-proprietary Westinghouse documents submitted in connection with generic or plant specific reviews and approvals, as well as the issuance, denial, amendment, transfer, renewal, modification, suspension, revocation or violation of a license, permit, order or regulation, copyright protection notwithstanding, to satisfy public requests. This authorization is granted with the understanding that any copies of documents made by the NRC will continue to bear the copyright notice, which will be reproduced along with the documents when the documents are being copied. The authorization set forth above does not extend to the proprietary version of Westinghouse documents submitted to the NRC (This does not in any way affect the permission previously granted to the NRC to make copies of such documents for internal use by the NRC).

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
