
SUBJECT: MEETING SUMMARY FOR PUBLIC MEETING WITH SOUTHERN





Assessment


San Onofre is operating safely

- NRC continued increased oversight
- Progress in addressing Human Performance, Problem Identification and Resolution, and Safety Conscious Work Environment

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Assessment (cont.)

Performance has improved since 2009:

- Problem Identification and Resolution
- Confirmatory Order for willful violations
- White finding for inadequate work instructions


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NRC Plans for 2011

- Follow up inspections to review Safety Conscious Work Environment and Human Performance
- Baseline inspection activities

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Assessment (cont.)

Performance Challenges remain:

- Human Performance
- High number of safety concerns received by NRC in 2010, (recent trend is lowering)
- Willingness to raise concerns with SONGS management

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NRC – Fukushima actions

- NRC monitoring and technical support of Japanese response
- Immediate inspection of all US plants
- Established High Level Task Force

NRC – Task Force Actions

- Near term response (90 days)
 - evaluate event information
 - apply to inspection and plant operation
- Long term actions
 - detailed event review
 - identify regulatory changes

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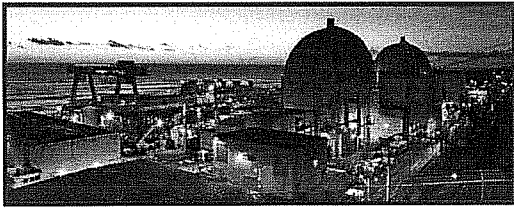

- NRC 2010 Annual Assessment Letter – March
 - Units 2&3 continue to operate safely and reliably
 - Loose Battery Connection (White Finding) closed
 - Firewatch Documentation (Confirmatory Order) closed
 - Problem Identification and Resolution issue closed
 - Human Performance issue remains open
 - Safety Conscious Work Environment issue remains open
- Safely completed Unit 3 Steam Generator Replacement outage
- Successfully completed FEMA graded exercise
- Continued safe and reliable operation

Human Performance – Actions Taken

- Completed comprehensive gap analysis – "check and adjust"
- Implementing actions to drive further improvements
 - Human error prevention techniques
 - Procedure use and adherence – stop when uncertain
 - Supervisory and management oversight



2011 Key Focus Areas

- Continued safe and reliable operations
- Improve human performance
- Improve nuclear safety culture
- Sustained performance improvement



Human Performance – Results

- Strengthening station engagement through division alignment
 - Human Performance Advocates
 - Division excellence plans
 - Monthly Division Management Review Meetings on Human Performance and Safety
- Indications of improved performance since April 2010
 - Station event rate by 50%
 - Division event rate by 30%
 - Leadership Observation Programs and Nuclear Notifications

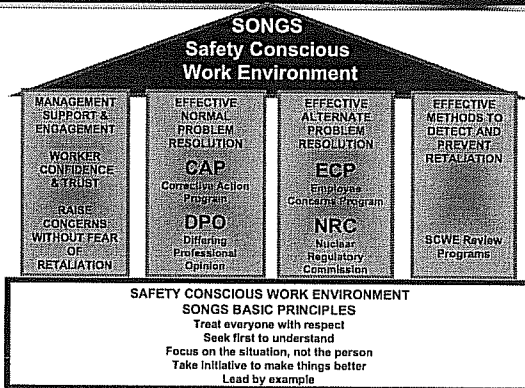

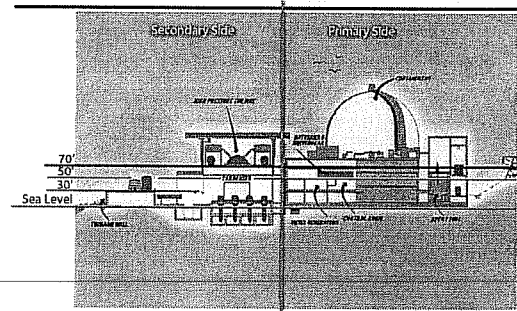
Current Results

Our Design

- Different type of seismic risks and fault structure in California
- Different type of tsunami threat
- Different plant design basis
 - Pressurized water vs. boiling water
 - Robust containment
 - Location of critical safety-related equipment
- Robust back-up systems and safety features
- "Beyond Design" response guidelines



Emergency Electrical Supplies



- Two emergency diesel generators per unit
- Ability to cross-connect: only one emergency diesel generator needed
- 30 ft. elevation, building built to withstand seismic and flooding

- Seven-day supply of diesel fuel
- Subsurface vaults, built to withstand seismic and flooding



Battery Room



Switchgear Room

- Emergency batteries and switch gears
- 50 ft. elevation, built to withstand seismic and flooding

Emergency Preparedness

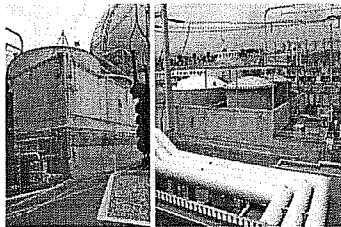
Interjurisdictional Planning Committee

- Established in 1982, eight primary members including SCE
- Meets monthly
- Unique partnership between government and private industry
- Dedicated to ensure public health and safety



Dedicated Water Supplies

- On-site, seismically qualified tanks
- Two trains: electrical pumps, valves and pipes
- Additional steam-driven pump for heat removal through the steam generators
