By letter dated June 30, 2011, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission has notified the Committee of its requests to reprogram \$30,000,000 for activities in fiscal year 2011. The Committee approves the following activities, totaling \$26,000,000:

- 1) Nuclear Reactor Safety, Direct Program Activities (\$7,300,000);
- 2) Nuclear Reactor Safety, Infrastructure Activities (\$14,960,000); and
- 3) Nuclear Materials and Waste Safety, Infrastructure Activities (\$3,740,000).

The Committee does not approve the requested reprogramming for High Level Waste Program activities.
