LICENSE RENEWAL OF NUCLEAR PLANTS REGARDING SEABROOK  
STATION

Dear Mr. Keel:

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is considering an application submitted by NextEra Energy Seabrook, LLC, for the renewal of the Seabrook Station, Unit 1 (Seabrook Station) operating license. Seabrook Station is located 13 miles south of Portsmouth, New Hampshire. The application for renewal was submitted by NextEra Energy Seabrook, LLC, in a letter dated May 25, 2010, pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* Part 54 (10 CFR Part 54). As part of the NRC's review, a site-specific supplemental environmental impact statement (SEIS) to the *Generic Environmental Impact Statement for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants* (GEIS), NUREG-1437, has been prepared under 10 CFR Part 51, the NRC's regulation that implements the National Environment Policy Act of 1969, as amended. The SEIS includes an analysis of environmental issues, and in accordance with 36 CFR 800.8(c), will include analyses of potential impacts to historic properties.



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
