Research is seeking participants to take part in the State-of-the-Art Reactor Consequence Analysis (SOARCA) project. Surry and Peach Bottom were selected earlier this year and have actively participated by providing, on a voluntary basis, site-specific information to support the project. Completion of these two sites is projected for Fall 2007. Research would now like to reach out to other possible volunteers with the goal of obtaining commitments from three or four to assist/support remaining information needs of the project (completion of the entire project is targeted for Fall 2008). To date, Sequoyah has agreed to participate, so two or three more commitments are needed from the following candidates: San Onofre, St. Lucie, Palisades, Salem, TMI, and ANO-1.

Requested Action: Please contact your licensing POCs and set up an "Information Call" preferably this week, but no later than next Friday 9/7/07. I can help you with the initial call or e-mail to the licensee to set up the Information Call. Research (Bob Prato, Team Leader) will lead the Information Call, provide background on the project, and request your licensees to participate. Rich Guzman is the NRR/DORL SOARCA POC, but I will be coordinating the SOARCA effort with plant PMs and Research this week while he is out. The attached document is a general overview of the project with preliminary Research information needs - forward this document to your licensee to use as a read-ahead for the Information Call. Your licensee can decide which appropriate individuals on their staff should be on the call (based on the general project info and scope provided in the attached). On our side, core participants on the Information Call should be Bob Prato, Rich Guzman or myself, and the DORL PM.

Please get back to me with a date/time/room/call-in number for the Information Call as soon as possible. This is a high priority, high visibility project within Research and Bob will be very flexible to support just about any time this week or next.
