Here is the letter from our CAMA rep. He determined that we do not need a CAMA permit, however we still need to go through the CAMA consistency review.

Our next steps are outlined below:

- 1- Meet with Army Corps of Engineers and NC Division of Water Quality to determine if we need to apply for a 401 permit, or if they can write us a letter stating that we do not need one
- 2- Develop and submit a CAMA consistency application (they have 6 months to review and respond)
- 3- If we need a 401 permit, develop a stormwater management plan, submit and obtain a stormwater permit, then develop and submit a 401 permit application
- 4- The 401 permit can take a year to obtain, we would ask them to expedite their review so that we could obtain the permit in time for the NRC license to be issued
