


**PROGRAM SCOPE**

This was the initial inspection of activities under this license. Because the licensee had not yet begun licensed activities or acquired any licensed materials, the next inspection was set at one year in accordance with MC 2800.

The licensee planned to perform diagnostic and therapeutic nuclear medicine procedures for cats and dogs. They had constructed facilities consistent with maps provided to NRC in the license application, though they had not yet ordered the camera, nuclear medicine instrumentation, or survey instruments. A meeting was planned for September 2011 to determine whether the licensee would begin operations or terminate the license. The RSO stated that licensed operations could begin in December or January based on this decision.

The RSO stated that he would notify NRC when operations had begun. He further stated that training of licensee personnel involved in the nuclear medicine procedures would be performed prior to beginning operations.
