PURPOSE: The purposes of the meeting are to: (1) brief stakeholders on the staff's preliminary plans for implementation of the Tier 3 recommendations, (2) provide an opportunity for stakeholders and the NRC staff to exchange information on the Tier 3 recommendations, and (3) afford stakeholders an opportunity to ask the NRC staff clarifying and amplifying questions on the plans and provide input for consideration before the plans are finalized.

The Background information on the Tier 3 recommendations can be found in SECY-11-0137, "Prioritization of Recommended Actions to be Taken in Response to Fukushima Lessons," and SECY-12-0025, "Proposed Orders and Requests for Information in Response to Lessons Learned from Japan's March 11, 2011, Great Tohoku Earthquake and Tsunami Learned."

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CATEGORY 3¹: This is a Category 3 Meeting: Public participation is actively sought for this meeting to fully engage the public in a discussion of regulatory issues. Public input on the Tier 3 recommendation plans is specifically requested².
