

Gaming board fines Mount Airy

HARRISBURG — Mount Airy Casino Resort has been fined \$20,000 by state regulators for doing business with a company also owned by founder Louis A. DeNaples during the period his state casino operator's license was suspended. The state Gaming Control Board approved the fine Wednesday as part of a consent agreement with the Monroe County casino.

The matter dates to February 2008 when the board suspended DeNaples' license after he was charged with perjury by the Dauphin County District Attorney's Office. The suspension order led to Mount Airy being placed under a trusteeship.

Mount Airy was barred from doing business with North American Warhorse Inc., a firm that DeNaples owns 80 percent of, while DeNaples' license was suspended. Warhorse provided power-sports equipment to Mount Airy.

According to the consent order, Mount Airy officials were formally notified not to do further business with

Warhorse in April 2008. Yet, Mount Airy made two payments to Warhorse on July 29, 2008, and Aug. 26, 2008, totaling \$17,051 during the license suspension period.

The gaming board lifted the suspension of DeNaples' license in June 2009 after the district attorney dismissed the perjury charges. Under agreements reached then, DeNaples withdrew from controlling or managing the casino's affairs while his daughter, Lisa DeNaples, D.M.D., became head of a family trust to run Mount Airy.

In a separate matter, the gaming board is considering a petition from Mount Airy to end DeNaples' status as a state licensee and include two other children, Dr. Louis A. DeNaples Jr. and Donna Dileo as managing members of the family trust.

The consent agreement includes a provision stating that this won't prevent the gaming board from considering any facts in a proceeding relating to an application for a license or qualification of a licensee.

Snö Mountain nearing refinancing deal

Snö Mountain officials have renegotiated a state loan that the ski resort defaulted on, and its spokeswoman said the resort remains on track for a complete refinancing of its other debt.

But Lackawanna County's Tax Claim Bureau director wants proof the refinancing includes payment of back county and Scranton School District real estate taxes or he plans to go to court to get permission to collect the taxes directly out of the resort's revenues.

"I don't want to play hardball and put them completely out of business, but we want to get paid," Ron Koldjeski said. "I'd rather try to get some money now and work it out. Better than waiting and better than getting zero. Right now, it's producing revenues. The ski resort is up there making some money."

The resort owes \$472,834.38

in county and school district taxes, interest and fees for 2009 and 2010, the back taxes the Tax Claim Bureau is responsible for collecting, Koldjeski said. It also owes the city more than \$126,424.23 for the same years, he said.

Snö Mountain opened in December, a little later than normal because of mild weather, and was operating 21 of its 27 trails Thursday, General Manager Mark Verrastro said. Like many resorts nationwide, Snö Mountain is struggling to stay open amid less than ideal weather for snowmaking, Verrastro said.

"We're down a bit, but we're hoping for a big February to boost us back," he said.

Verrastro said he could not comment further on aspects of the refinancing.

Verrastro had said the refinancing would be complete by early December, but spokeswoman Caroline Pennartz said the holiday crush slowed down the finalization.

"We're hoping the next cou-

ple of weeks," Pennartz said when asked when it would be completed. "It's just taking a little bit longer than we originally anticipated."

The resort worked out a new deal for the approximately \$4.5 million balance on a \$5 million machinery and equipment loan it received from the state Department of Community and Economic Development in April 2009.

The company made 15 payments on the loan, the last one in December 2010.

The original loan was to be paid back over seven years at

a 5 percent interest rate. The new loan is a new 10-year term at 3 percent, said Theresa Elliott, department deputy press secretary. The company does not have to make any payments over the first year, but interest will accrue and be added onto the balance before payments are scheduled to resume, Elliott said.

The company is on the hook for a \$7.5 million mortgage with Boyertown-based National Penn Bank that was renegotiated in November 2010, a month before the payments on the state loan stopped.

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
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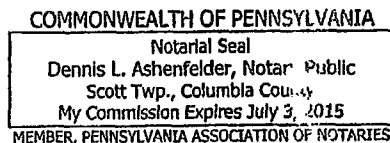

What makes us ticklish still a mystery

DEAR DOCTOR: I am a very ticklish person. My husband thinks it's hilarious how easy it is to make me giggle and squirm. What causes ticklishness?

DEAR READER: Ticklishness is indeed a mysterious phenomenon, and not just for you. To this day no one has adequately answered the question of what causes it.

When discussing ticklishness, most people mean the kind that makes you laugh and squirm. Let's call this laughter-associated ticklishness. There's another type, like what happens when you run your fingernails lightly over your skin. But I'll focus on the first, since you asked. Although there isn't a solid, science-based answer for why we're ticklish, that hasn't kept people from researching and speculating. Some of the top theories include these:

■ Ticking boards people. A mom tickles her baby, the baby laughs, the mom smiles, and they share a happy moment together. Similarly, kids who tickle each other may bond over the experience.

■ Ticklish spots of the body. Such as the abdomen or neck, tend to be more vulnerable. Learning to protect them from tickling as a child may help you protect them from harm.

I doubt this theory, however. I think it has some holes in it. For example, the

Study: Teens vague on pregnancy knowledge

ATLANTA—A new government study suggests a lot of teenage girls are clueless about their chances of getting pregnant.

In a survey of thousands of teenage mothers who had unintended pregnancies, about a third said they didn't use birth control because they didn't believe they could get pregnant.

What were they thinking, exactly? Not clear. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention survey didn't ask teens to explain their reasoning.

But other researchers have talked to teen moms who believed they couldn't get pregnant the first time they had sex, didn't think they could get pregnant at that time of the month or thought they were sterile.

This report underscores how much misperception, antivivulence and magical thinking put teens at risk for unintended pregnancy," said Bill Albert, a spokesman for the Washington, D.C.-based National Campaign to Prevent Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy.

Other studies have asked teens about their contraceptive use and beliefs about pregnancy. But the CDC report released Thursday is the first to focus on teens who didn't want to get pregnant but did.

The researchers interviewed nearly 5,000 teenage girls in 19 states who gave birth after unplanned pregnancies in 2004 through 2008. The survey was done through mailed questionnaires with telephone follow-up.

About half of the girls in the survey said they were not using any birth control when they got pregnant. That's higher than surveys of teens in general, which have found that fewer than 20 percent said they didn't use contraception the last time they had sex.

"I think what surprised us was the extent that they were not using contraception," said Laurie Gavin, a CDC senior scientist who co-authored the report.

Some of the teen moms were asked what kind of birth control they used. Nearly 20 percent said they used the pill or a birth control patch. Another 24 percent said they used condoms.

head and hands are particularly vulnerable to injury, but they are not particularly ticklish.

■ Increased skin sensitivity. On certain areas of the body develops before birth to encourage a fetus to stay in the healthiest positions in the womb. This centuries-old theory doesn't seem to have any modern evidence to support it.

The biggest question is whether laughter-associated ticklishness is an uncontrollable reflex, something that is "hard-wired" inside us at birth. Many experts believe that is likely, but others think this kind of ticklishness is something we learn as babies by interacting with our parents and others.

My own guess is that both theories are true. We are born with a tendency to be ticklish, and then interactions with others re-

force that tendency. One interesting fact is that you can't tickle yourself. Once again, there is no convincing scientific data to explain this. If you try to tickle yourself, you'll know where and when it's going to happen, and that might cancel out the tickle.

One idea is that, like your startle reflex, laughter-associated tickling requires that you not know it's coming. Indeed, some studies have shown that people laugh more when they are blindfolded and don't know where or when they'll be tickled. However, I'm not sure I believe that theory either. Even if I'm not surprised, even if I know that someone is trying to tickle me, and then she does it—I still laugh. What about you?

Why are we ticklish? Why do we yawn? Why do we yawn when we see someone else yawn? Why do we laugh at certain things? Why are we so many adults—including big, powerful adults—terrified by tiny non-poisonous spiders? There are so many

things that seem to be part of being human that we don't even begin to understand. The question is: Do we need to?

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Northwest Area residents may face tax hike next year

UNION TWP. — Under a preliminary 2012-2013 budget unanimously approved at Wednesday night's school board meeting, Northwest Area School District residents face a tax increase that at present could average out to \$20 to \$25 more in real estate taxes.

Under a plan that was presented by Albert Melone Jr., financial adviser, the board approved a budget draft that encompasses about \$17.7 million in projected revenues and an estimated \$17.9 million in proposed expenditures resulting in a deficit of about \$234,509.

Melone said, however, that at this point the district is only complying with state regulations to adopt a tentative budget.

"The real process will come in April and May," he said, when being bought out by the federal government.

Partnership discusses sharing code enforcement and other services between members.

DALLAS TWP. — Members of the Back Mountain Community Partnership discussed the inclusion of Lake Township into the group and the possibility of sharing code enforcement and other services between municipalities at a meeting Thursday.

Amy Salansky, a Lake Township supervisor, attended the partnership meeting to retrieve more information about joining the group. The partnership currently includes Dallas Borough and Dallas, Franklin, Jackson, Kingston and Lehman townships.

"I would like to be able to take

back the information I obtain today — to my other two supervisors to kind of seal the deal and join with you guys," she said.

Lake Township officials sent the partnership a letter last month about the process for entering into the governmental partnership.

Solicitor Jeff Malik said Lake Township will need to pass an ordinance affirming its inclusion in the group. The partnership will make a recommendation for or against Lake Township's participation, and a unanimous vote from each individual municipality will be needed before Lake Township could join. Then the partnership will need to vote to amend the intergovernmental cooperation agreement to include Lake Township.

Vice Chairman John Wilkosz, of Jackson Township, said Lake Township is already part of the

Chairman James Rehn Jr., of Kingston Township, said the supervisors also sent a letter of support for the partnership latest grant application.

In other matters, Wilkosz discussed the sharing of code enforcement and third-party inspection services among partnership members.

He said many of the municipalities have similar comprehensive plans that were drawn by the same organizations and similar zoning ordinances.

Wilkosz even pointed out that three municipalities in the part-

PPL Bell Bend, LLC has proposed to withdraw up to 1.0 million gallons per day as a maximum 30-day average from a shallow glacial outwash aquifer located on property owned by PPL Bell Bend, LLC (tax ID number 26-3159555) in Salem Township, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania. There will be no consumptive use associated with this project. The excavation to bedrock and placement of structural fill to design elevations must be done in a dry condition during foundation construction, which may extend up to two years. The water will be removed to permit the construction of the Essential Service Water Emergency Make-up System (ESWEMS) pond. This pond is a safety-related plant feature and must have a foundation placed on competent bedrock. All water removed from the shallow glacial outwash aquifer beneath the ESWEMS pond during construction will be returned via overflow or spray irrigation to an adjacent stream and wetlands per a mitigation plan that will be evaluated as part of the PADEP 105 permit and USACE Section 404 permit reviews.

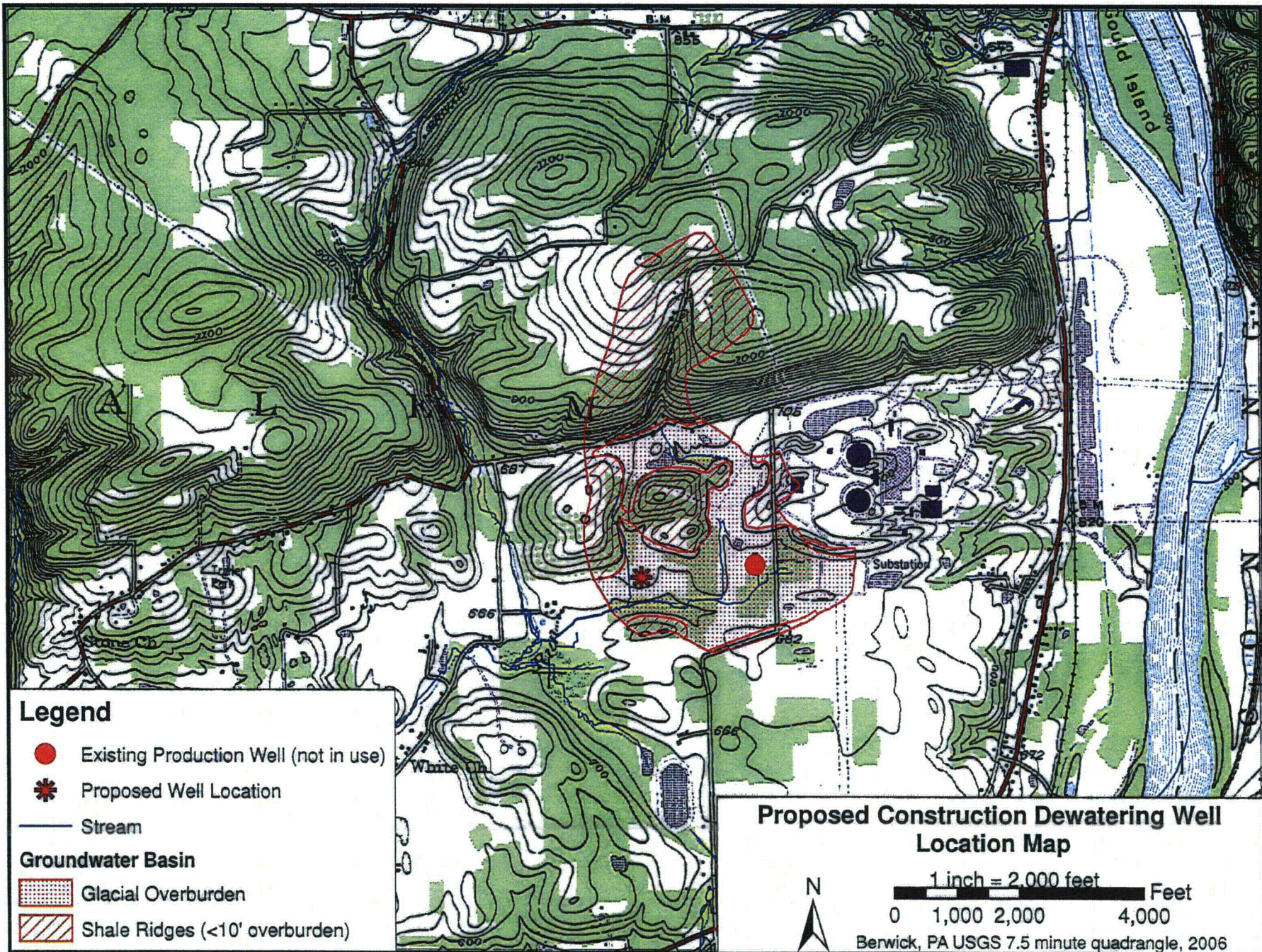
