In May, 18 states had over-the-month unemployment rate increases, 14 states and the District of Columbia had decreases, and 18 states had no change. Nonfarm payroll employment was up in 27 states and the district, down in 22 states, and unchanged in Maine. [More »](#)

Jobless rates were lower in May than a year earlier in 331 of the 372 metropolitan areas, higher in 32, and unchanged in 9. Nonfarm payroll employment was up in 266 metropolitan areas over the year, down in 101, and unchanged in 5. [More »](#)
