The 2006-2010 American Community Survey (ACS) Selected Population Tables (SPT) are now available for the U.S., states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and many smaller geographic areas, including census tracts. This dataset provides detailed data on social, economic, demographic and housing for up to 392 race, Hispanic, tribal, and ancestry groups. Availability of SPT tables for a population group is limited to population groups with at least 50 unweighted sample cases in a particular geographic area. This dataset provides many estimates that were previously available in the Census 2000 Summary File 4 (SF4). [more »](#)
