Dear Mr. Halstead:

Thank you for your letter dated June 29, 2012, in which you requested a 60-day extension of the public comment period for Spent Fuel Transportation Risk Assessment, Draft Report for Comment, NUREG-2125. The Federal Register notice published on May 14, 2012, announced a 60-day comment period for the Draft Report ending July 13, 2012.

The comment period was established for 60 days, as opposed to 30 or 45 days, in consideration of the Draft Report's length and complexity. Further, the Draft Report is scheduled for review by the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) on September 5, 2012. For these reasons, we are not extending the comment due date of July 13, 2012. Comments received after this date will be considered if it is practical to do so, but the NRC staff is able to ensure consideration only for comments received on or before this date.

Procedures for the conduct of and participation in ACRS meetings were published in the Federal Register on October 17, 2011, (76 FR 64126–64127). In accordance with those procedures, oral or written views may be presented by members of the public, including representatives of the nuclear industry. Persons desiring to make oral statements should notify cognizant ACRS Staff five days before the meeting, if possible, so that appropriate arrangements can be made to allow necessary time during the meeting for such statements.
