In February, 29 states reported over-the-month unemployment rate decreases, 8 had increases, and 13 and the District of Columbia had no change. Nonfarm payroll employment increased in 42 states and the district and decreased in 8 states. [More »](#)

Metropolitan Area Employment and Unemployment (Monthly)

March 23, 2012

Jobless rates were lower in January than a year earlier in 345 of the 372 metropolitan areas, higher in 16, and unchanged in 11. Nonfarm payroll employment was up in 270 metropolitan areas over the year, down in 94, and unchanged in 8. [More »](#)
