Dear Mr. Wroblewski:

Enclosed is a corrected copy of Amendment No. 133, which was originally issued on July 3, 2012, to your NRC Material License No. 13-00133-02 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in bold font.

The corrected copy was not issued because of an error identified in Amendment No. 133. It was issued in order to complete the review of the requests made in your letters dated January 30, 2012, and May 24, 2012.

Amendment No. 133 was originally issued partially to approve several authorized users whom you needed to have added to the license within a certain timeframe to facilitate the timely delivery of patient care. Hence, that part of the review was accomplished sooner.

We were able to complete our review and approve the rest of your requests at this time. Therefore, we are issuing the corrected copy to capture the remaining requests made in the correspondence listed above.

Please note that, in order for us to approve the release of your soon-to-be former HDR use room for unrestricted use, it will be necessary for you to submit a copy of the final leak test on the last HDR source used in the old room.

Please specifically request the release of this room for unrestricted use and submit this information as an amendment request, directed to my attention at the above address as "additional information to control number 577661," to facilitate proper handling in our offices. We will then continue our review.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.
