MEMORANDUM AND ORDER
(Petition for Intervention)

On November 18, 1993, Native Americans for a Clean Environment (NACE) filed a motion for leave to intervene in this proceeding involving an Order issued by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to the Sequoyah Fuels Corporation and General Atomics Corporation. The Order, which was issued on October 15, 1993, concerns decommissioning funding for the Sequoyah Fuels site at Gore, Oklahoma.¹

Upon consideration of this matter, and the arguments related to it provided by other participants, the Board herein grants the NACE motion to intervene. A written order, detailing the Board's basis for this ruling, will be issued in due time, and will be appealable within ten days


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after service of the written order in accordance with 10 C.F.R. § 2.714a(a).

The petitioner, NACE, shall file a supplement to its petition listing the contentions it seeks to have litigated in this proceeding by the close of business on February 8, 1994. In order for NACE to participate as a party in this proceeding, it must submit at least one contention meeting the requirements of 10 C.F.R. § 2.714(b)(2) of the Commission's regulations.
