**A.2 TASK/DELIVERY ORDER PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE (AUG 2011)**

This order shall commence on the Date of Award and will expire on September 30, 2013.

**A.3 STATEMENT OF WORK****Background**

NRR is responsible for accomplishing key components of the NRC's nuclear reactor safety mission. As such, NRR conducts a range of regulatory activities in four primary program areas to protect the public health, safety, and the environment. All NRR staff directly or indirectly support the major programs of rulemaking, licensing, oversight, and incident response for two significant classes of licensees: those using commercial power reactors and those using test and research reactors. NRR works together with the regions and other offices to accomplish our mission and contribute to the agency mission. These activities are conducted in a balanced manner that fosters trust, which is accomplished by delivering results, acting with integrity, and demonstrating concern for others. This approach ensures that NRC's organizational values of integrity, service, openness, commitment, cooperation, excellence, and respect are reflected in NRR's actions. The expected outcome of the principled implementation of the four major NRR programs is the protection of public health, safety, and the environment.

Over the past few years, NRR's leadership has utilized outside resources to assist NRR's management team in understanding and adopting the Office Director's management philosophy – forward focus. With the large turnover of Senior Managers in NRR, the Office Director wants to ensure that the new cadre of leaders understand and adopt this philosophy to help them work as a collaborative team. Having utilized NRC's Organization Development (OD) contract in the past, the Office Director has requested assistance from Suntiva to help in this endeavor.

**Deliverables**

Specifically, NRR requires that Suntiva, under Contract No.: NRC-38-10-723A, provide the following services and deliverables to its leadership and management team:

**Senior OD Consultant**

- a. Review relevant background materials. Prepare for and meet with Office Director (Deputy Office Directors and a member of NRR's Leadership Team) initially to discuss desired outcomes for the offsites, and subsequently to review the draft offsite design. (Estimated 5 hours – Senior OD Consultant, 1 hour - Program Manager)
- b. Design and facilitate an off-site meeting with NRR's senior leaders which would introduce the Office Director's management philosophy to new leaders, and reinforce the management philosophy to current leaders. This will include incorporating the "Behavior Matters" initiative into the discussion. (Estimated 28 hours – Senior OD Consultant, 2 hours – Program Manager)
- c. Design and conduct two half-day sessions at later dates to reinforce the learning from the initial off-site, and discuss the successes/challenges of putting the knowledge gleaned into practice. (Estimated 25 hours – Senior OD Consultant, 2 hours – Program Manager)
- d. The Suntiva Consultant/Coach will liaise with the Suntiva Program Manager and NRC Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) to ensure the work is delivered on time, on budget and is of high quality. The effectiveness of the work will be evaluated per the NRC's OD contractual requirements. (Estimated 3 hours – Senior OD Consultant, 3 hours – Program Manager)

**Expected Overall Outcomes**

- Clearly defined client/consultant objectives regarding scope and expectations to include strategies for engaging Branch Chiefs.
- Senior Leaders' awareness, understanding and reinforcement of the Office Director's management philosophy of "forward focus," and tools to aid in NRR's implementation of the agency's "Behavior Matters" initiative.
- Enhanced skill sets to identify and address difficult situations regarding non-adherence to organizational values at all levels (management and staff) within the organization.
- Enhanced ability to collaborate with one another.

**Purchase of Capital Property:** (\$50,000 or more with life of one year or longer)

Contractors must report to the Contracting Officer, electronically, any capital property acquired with contract funds having an initial cost of \$50,000 or more, in accordance with procedures set forth in NRC Management Directive (MD) 13.1, IV, C – "Reporting Requirements" (revised 2/16/2011).

**Agency Payment Office:** Payment will continue to be made by the office designated in the contract in Block 12 of the Standard Form 26, or Block 25 of the Standard Form 33, whichever is applicable.

**Frequency:** The contractor shall submit claims for reimbursement once each month, unless otherwise authorized by the Contracting Officer.

**Format:** Invoices/Vouchers shall be submitted in the format depicted on the attached sample form entitled "Invoice/Voucher for Purchases and Services Other Than Personal". Alternate formats are permissible only if they address all requirements of the Billing Instructions. The instructions for preparation and itemization of the invoice/voucher are included with the sample form.

**Task Order Contracts:** The contractor must submit a separate invoice/voucher for each individual task order with detailed cost information. This includes all applicable cost elements and other items discussed in paragraphs (a) through (q) of the attached instructions. In addition, the invoice/voucher must specify the contract number, and the NRC-assigned task/delivery order number.

**Billing of Costs after Expiration of Contract:** If costs are incurred during the contract period and claimed after the contract has expired, you must cite the period during which these costs were incurred. To be considered a proper expiration invoice/voucher, the contractor shall clearly mark it "EXPIRATION INVOICE" or "EXPIRATION VOUCHER".

#### **4. Definitions**

Material handling costs. When included as part of material costs, material handling costs shall include only costs clearly excluded from the labor-hour rate.
