


LICENSEE: The inspection was an examination of the activities conducted under your license as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) rules and regulations and the conditions of your license. The inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspector. During this inspection, certain of your activities, as described below and/or attached, were in violation of NRC requirements and are being cited in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. This form is a NOTICE OF VIOLATION, which may be subject to posting in accordance with 10 CFR 19.11. (Violations and Corrective Actions) <p>10 CFR 71.5(a) requires that a licensee who transports licensed material outside of the site of usage, as specified in the NRC license, or where transport is on public highways, or who delivers license material to a carrier for transport, comply with the applicable requirements of the regulation appropriate to the mode of transport of the Department of Transportation (DOT) in 49 CFR Parts 170 through 189. 49 CFR 172.704(c)(2) states that a HAZMAT employee shall receive training required by this subpart at least once every three years.</p> <p>Contrary to the above, the licensee did not ensure that authorized users (HAZMAT employees), who performed functions subject to the requirements of 49 CFR Parts 171 - 177 were trained as required. Specifically, all authorized users had not received HAZMAT training since the last NRC inspection performed in September 2007.</p> <p>This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement 6.3). As corrective action, the licensee arranged for HAZMAT training presented by their consultant on April 2, 2013 to authorized gauge users.</p>			
Statement of Corrective Actions
