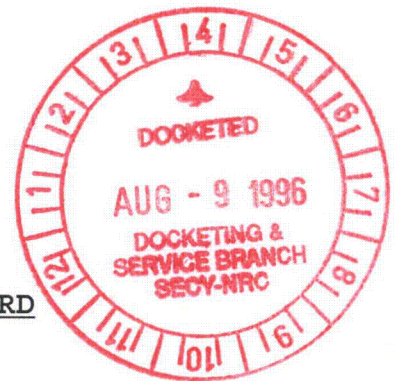

MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

COMES NOW the State of Oklahoma, by and through Jeannine Hale, Assistant Attorney General, and moves the Board for an Extension of Time to review and comment upon the Nuclear Regulatory Commission Staff's and General Atomics' Joint Motion For Approval Of Settlement Agreement filed on July 11, 1996.

In support of this Motion, the State of Oklahoma states as follows:

(1) That the Commission or the presiding officer may extend the amount of time prescribed for response to this Joint Motion upon a showing of good cause under 10 C.F.R § 2.711.

(2) That the final outcome of this enforcement action against General Atomics is of vital importance to the State of Oklahoma because the facility in question is located in Gore, Oklahoma and poses a severe threat of harm to the citizens and environment of this state.

(3) That the State of Oklahoma did not receive service of the Joint Motion for Approval of Settlement Agreement.

(4) That the State of Oklahoma did not have notice of the

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Joint Motion until it received service of the Native Americans for a Clean Environment's (NACE) Motion for Emergency Stay of the Effectiveness of the Agreement and requested a copy of the Joint Motion from NACE, which was received on July 31, 1996.


(5) That because the State of Oklahoma had no knowledge of the Joint Motion for Settlement Agreement, the state was unable to review and respond to the substance of the Motion.

(6) That the interests of the State of Oklahoma will be prejudiced if the state is unable to review and comment on the Joint Motion for Settlement Agreement before it is considered by the Board.

WHEREFORE, the State of Oklahoma moves this Board to extend the time for comment and withhold its final approval of the Joint Motion for Settlement Agreement until such time as the State of Oklahoma has an opportunity to review and comment on the proposed agreement.

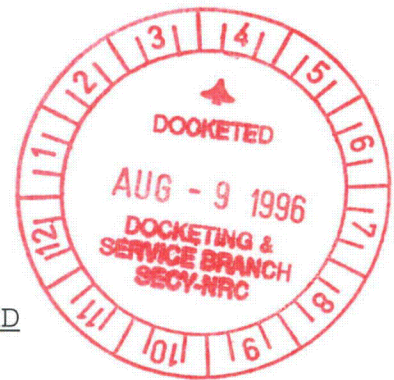

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
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
