A few minutes after 10:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 17, 1995, our office received a partial copy of the Intervenor's Motion to Compel General Atomics and Sequoyah Fuels Corporation to Answer Intervenor's First Set of Requests for Production of Documents. When I reviewed the document the next day, I noticed that it included only 14 pages and that the signature page was missing. My secretary promptly telephoned you to ask for the signature page. To be conservative, and on the assumption that only a page or two was missing from the document, she asked for copies of the last four pages of the document. Copies of those pages were subsequently received.

On August 20, I again reviewed what I thought was the complete document. I noticed for the first time that the last two pages were numbered 38-39. Obviously, a gap of 25 pages remained.

Today, we received by mail the first complete copy of the Motion to Compel. Consequently, pursuant to the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board's August 8, 1995 Order, our response to this latest Motion to Compel will be filed no later than August 28, 1995, i.e., seven days subsequent to the date on which the motion was served. Since the Motion is addressed jointly to General Atomics and Sequoyah Fuels Corporation (footnote 1 of your Motion to Compel makes the point that many of the document requests directed to the two parties and many of the objections to the requests "are identical", counsel for Sequoyah Fuels Corporation has advised me that he intends to file a response on behalf of that company in accordance with the same schedule.

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
