Dear Dr. Regits:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 02 to your NRC Material License No. 34-32840-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

In accordance with telephone conversations between Ms. Jean Chisnell, Michigan State University and you and Mr. Dan Hill and me on April 29 concerning the status of decommissioning financial assurance (DFA) for NRC license number 34-32840-01, it is our understanding that Cardinal Health will work with Ms. Chisnell and the university to determine the cost basis for the \$500,000 decommissioning cost estimate.

Furthermore, I explained that at this time we cannot remove license condition number 20 from your license until the DFA receives final approval.


Also, please note that we modified license condition number 18 to reflect the current language for authorizing waste to be held for decay in storage.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
