Dear Mr. DeLaBarre:

Enclosed is an application, dated April 29, 2013, received by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, from Humboldt Scientific, Inc. requesting an amendment to its existing license, XB1328. The license presently authorizes the export of 30 density/moisture gauges to Iraq. The gauges contain a total of 1.0111 TBq of Cesium-137 and 0.0444 TBq of Americium-241.

The purpose of the amendment is to: 1) add a distributor in Turkey as the "Intermediate Foreign Consignee(s)"; and 2) extend the expiration date from December 31, 2013 to June 30, 2015.

We consider this change to be a minor amendment, consistent with 10 CFR 170.31(15)(R), because the addition of Turkey as an intermediate consignee does not require an in depth analysis, review or consultations with other Executive Branch or foreign authorities.

Since no substantive changes to the terms and conditions of the existing license are requested, our office is processing this as minor amendment. Therefore, the NRC intends to issue the license after the required 30-day review period.
