To Whom it May Concern:

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, I hereby request the following records:

1. A complete chemical analysis of the "leached barium sulfate" that's alleged to have been dumped at West Lake Landfill. I specifically seek uranium-to-barium, radium-to-barium, and barium-to-silicon ratios.

To clarify: the NRC's 1982 report, titled "Radiological Survey of the West Lake Landfill," lists the ppm concentration of Barium, Lead, Zinc and Sulfate in the "radioactive materials from areas 1 and 2" (Table 13, page 109). According to the listed figures, the concentration of these chemicals adds up to less than 100%. I request a complete analysis of said radioactive materials.

In order to help you determine my status for the purpose of assessing fees, you should know that I am representative of the news media affiliated with the Internet and this request is made as part of news gathering and not for commercial use.
