Dear Sirs and Madam:


In behalf of the 120,000 members of the San Diego-Imperial Counties Labor Council I respectfully urge that the Board take action to provide the licensing approval of San Onofre Units 2 and 3. Our present capacity for energy production can hardly meet current needs for established residential and commercial consumption. Without Units 2 and 3 future economic development within our county will be severely restricted. Jobs needed to accommodate ordinary population gains would be limited. In addition, our ability to provide employment for the ever growing number of workers relocating from central and eastern states would be exhausted.

Beyond those considerations, members of organized labor, as citizens and rate payers, find no comfort in being held hostage to the whims of foreign oil producing interests.

Under these circumstances it is imperative that we make use of all established and cost effective means of energy production. The need for economic relief for local residential and commercial rate payers is critical.



Gentlemen:

As a taxpayer, registered voter, and a concerned citizen of Orange county, I urge you to not allow the licensing of San Onofre's units 2&3. It is my understanding that this particular power plant is built directly above an earthquake fault and the storage ponds of radioactive waste below the plant are not built to withstand the quake this fault has the capacity to produce. The power plant at San Onofre is located on a stretch of the coastline which is rich in marine life and surrounded by expensive residential zones, and I know that I am not the only citizen who feels this must be made COMPLETELY SAFE.

Thank you for giving the public chances to voice opinions through public hearings concerning the license. Please understand the pleads for Southern California's safety and preservation for the future.
