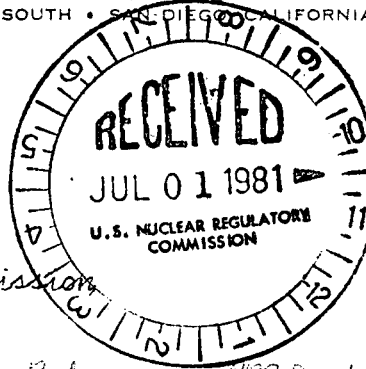

Gentlemen:

We are writing to urge the prompt licensing of Units 2 & 3  
of the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station.

In the past eleven months there have been two delays which  
have added \$320,000,000. to the capital costs of the plant, and each  
additional day's delay adds about \$1,000,000. per unit to our bills in  
fuel replacement costs.

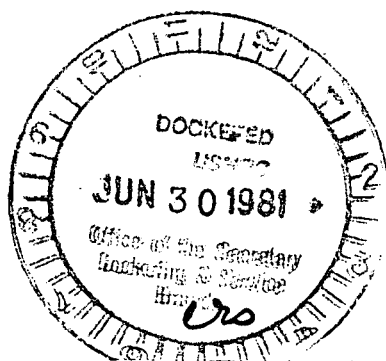
San Diego Gas & Electric Co.'s rates are among the highest  
in the nation, and are definitely the highest in California. We must  
stop burning oil which is the most expensive of fuels to generate elec-  
tricity while nuclear is one of the cheapest fuels available. Use of  
nuclear would help to stabilize our electric bills.

We urge your serious consideration in the matter of promptly  
licensing these facilities for operation.
