The licensing of Units 2 and 3 of the San Onofre Nuclear Power Plants is of great importance to all of us. I personally feel that it is urgent. that the license be granted without further delay for the following reasons.

- 2) Concern about an adequate supply of energy that is very critical in meeting the economic and social needs of the State of California.*
- 3) The nation's continued use and dependence on foreign oil as a source of energy coupled with the instability of the middle east.*



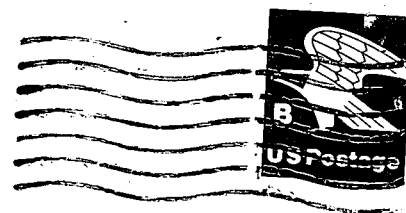
