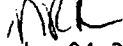
Jon --

I'll reach out to the French about this question and to confirm the agenda. Earlier today ASN sent me additional specific questions/topics that they hoped the NRC would be able to discuss during the bilat, including:

1. In service inspection of BMI nozzle :
 - What is the inspection program for BMI in the USA?
 - Does it exist feedback (or studies) about the SCC propagation kinetic in BMI?
2. Nickel alloy zones - in service inspection
 - Alloy 600 : What is the in-service inspection program in the USA? Does it depend on the plant operator?
 - Alloy 690 : What is the in-service inspection program in the USA?
 - What are the "North Anna case" consequences on inspection program and qualification process?
 - How does the qualification process work in the USA? Are there different qualification types?
3. Would it be possible to have a presentation about the "South Texas BMI case"? (defects detection, defects characterization, NRC position, reparation, feedback,...)

I'll copy you and Carla on the message.

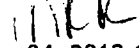

Jon and Bob –

After weeks (months?) of waiting, we finally have a draft agenda (or more accurately a detailed list of topics) from ASN for the December meeting – please see attached.
