We'll have a draft table for you by 9:45. It will probably have some holes, but it will give you an idea of what the final product will look like if you decide to use it. In addition to Tsunami information we are also collecting information on standing waves or seiches that are considered by plants on large bodies of water—like the Great Lakes. Also, for many coastal plants, it is the wave height from hurricanes that is the most limiting. We are trying to collect that information, as well. The seismic design information for each plant is expressed in terms of ground acceleration. We will provide you with the SSE and the OBE along with definitions of those terms. Hopefully, there won't be a request to compare the U.S. design basis levels to the Richter scale—because you really can't. Maybe Annie can help with this. I suppose you would be able to characterize the reverse i.e., what the ground acceleration was for a particular earthquake of a specified magnitude on the Richter scale. I tried to think about other questions that might come up, such as how do U.S. plants cope with a station blackout condition? Let me know if this works.

I cc'd you on an earlier e-mail. I wasn't sure what you meant by reference level earthquake. Did you mean review level earthquake? Also, I wondered how the Chairman was planning to use this information. The design basis is usually expressed in terms of ground acceleration (horizontal) with a more complete description in terms of a curve showing acceleration versus frequency. However, you wouldn't be able to infer what level earthquake (for example, on the Richter Scale) the plant would handle without the soil characteristics, etc. Sorry if I'm being pedantic--I just want to make sure we give you what you're looking for.





Also, I could anticipate that the Chairman might get a question about whether the NRC licensed coastal plants are designed for a design basis earthquake in combination with a maximum probable tsunami. Let me know if you need that information.

House to vote on stopgap government spending bill as parties battle over budget cuts

The Washington Post: WASHINGTON - The House is set to vote Tuesday on a measure cutting \$6 billion from the government's budget as the price for keeping it open three more weeks while the White House and Republican lawmakers seek a longer-term agreement on spending cuts.

The measure is needed to prevent a partial government shutdown when a temporary funding bill expires Friday at midnight. Dozens of federal agencies have been kept open under a series of stopgap bills since the 2011 budget year began last October. [MORE](#)

Petraeus to give upbeat view of Afghan fight

San Francisco Chronicle: The top U.S. commander in Afghanistan is facing an impatient and frustrated Congress, balancing his troops' solid progress in combat with worries about Kabul government corruption, an expected Taliban resurgence this spring and the slow development of Afghan security forces.

CBO Examines Options for Cutting DoD

Defense News: Cutting the Pentagon's budget by 1 percent annually over the next decade could save the federal government \$862 billion, according to a recently released Congressional Budget Office (CBO) report.

Cost estimators projected implementing 14 options for reducing defense spending in the March report. Another option includes limiting defense spending growth to 1.4 percent per year, 1 percentage point less than the current rate of growth, which would save about \$286 billion between 2012 and 2021. Freezing defense appropriations at February 2011 levels would reduce outlays about \$611 billion over the decade. [MORE](#)

TSA posted Saturday the results of an audit of tests for radiation emitted by its various X-ray scanning devices. 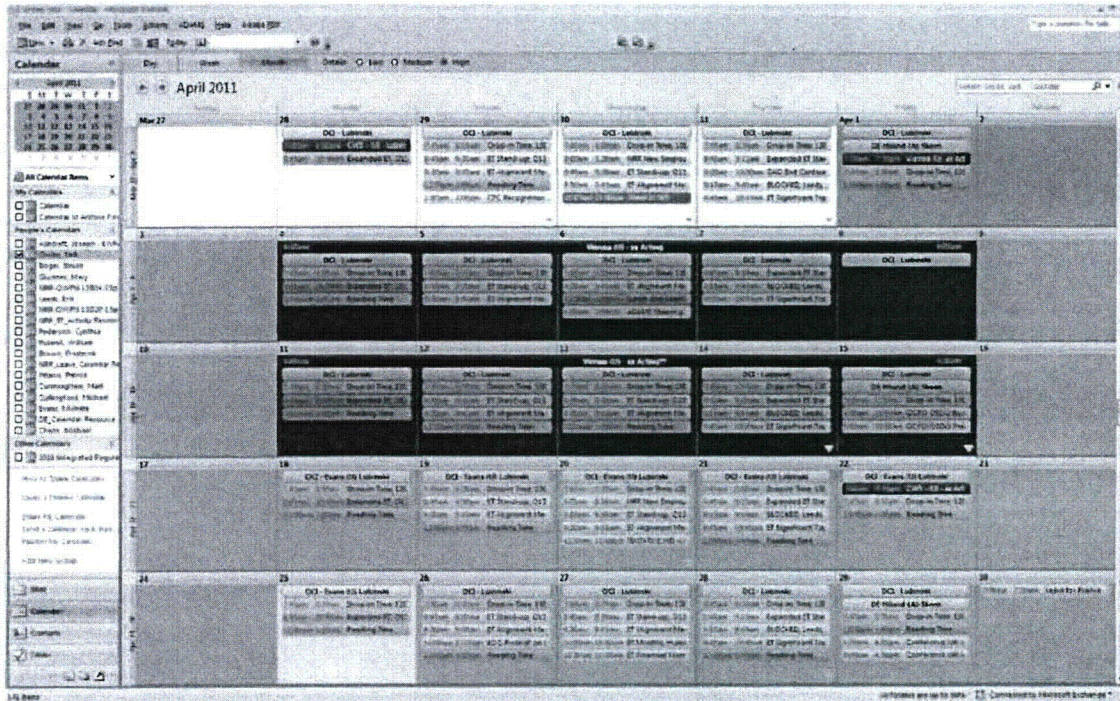

The Commission has approved the staff's recommended Option 1. The staff should evaluate current extended power uprate (EPU) applications, as well as future applications for new or increased credit for containment accident pressure (CAP), consistent with staff practice in implementing the current risk review guidance (Standard Review Plan Section 19.2), including the review of nonrisk-informed applications such as EPUs and the recently-developed deterministic guidance based on recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) to include uncertainty and margins in CAP calculations.

Because the statements in Regulatory Guide 1.174 are subject to different interpretations, the staff should revise this guide using precise language to assure that the defense-in-depth philosophy is interpreted and implemented consistently. To the extent that other regulatory guidance refers to defense in depth, the relevant documents should be updated also, as appropriate.

All things are never equal.

You've most likely heard someone make the remark, "All things being equal." Maybe you've even said it yourself, but I caution you to really consider what is being said. In the real world, all things are never equal. No two companies are identical, no two operations work the same, and even "same" products differ, for instance, in warehouse locations, cash flow and credit terms, reward programs, brand identity, or other factors. You will serve your organization better if you can see the differentiating factors that come into play when you're strategizing and forecasting its future. Try to avoid solving any challenge from the standpoint that "all things are equal," and instead be sure that you're considering realistic conditions that could "make" or "break" the achievement of desired outcomes.

Leading Your Team up a Ladder of Hope

Over the past three years, Sam, a manager who heads a 240-person business unit in a successful North American company, has seen a steady decline in staff morale, where team members seem increasingly indifferent to meeting organizational goals, even though the organization is hitting sales marks and doing more with less. He senses that it could be only a matter of time before

some staffers jump ship and find jobs elsewhere, despite his efforts to focus on better communication and education to keep them productive during rocky economic times. So what is really happening and how can Sam and leaders like him turn the tide?

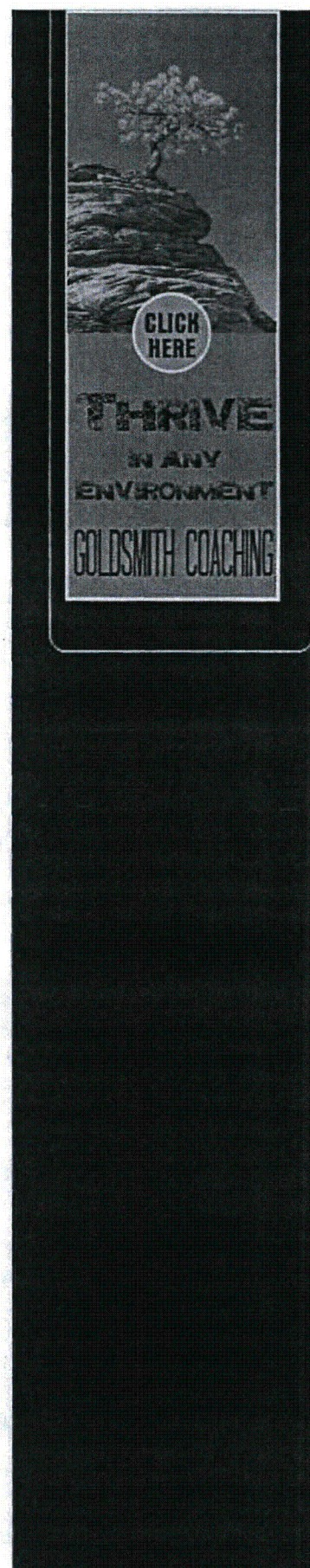
Certainly, our problematic economies of late were bound to play a role in workers' apathy. However, even multi-national firms and small businesses alike who have been prosperous from 2008 to the present have taken measures that have ultimately pushed employees to work harder and for longer hours, without the pay raises, bonuses, and benefits that thwart retention issues, burnout, and in many instances, lower productivity and output. Under these types of circumstances, your well-intentioned efforts to "improve communication" and "provide more education" aren't likely to motivate anyone to engage more. In fact, they can have the opposite effect.

When your staffers already feel overwhelmed and under-compensated, they don't want to give more without getting something back. Your aim to help can be perceived as yet another expectation of them to perform for the organization without any personal gain--financial or otherwise. They don't want to be forced to pry themselves away from the ever-growing pile of work they already have so that they can attend meetings to share their thoughts and feelings with you...especially if you're not able to alleviate the work load and offer some type of reward. In other words, if they can't find their personal payoff, they'll show up and do what they have to, but they won't be looking for new ways to contribute value to your organization.

The situation isn't much different than dealing with an athletic team's B squad, the group of people who are not "starters" and who rarely expect much (if any) play time during games. They have lost their motivation to excel over time, because try as they might to perform for their coaches, their efforts have been ignored and unrewarded. Oftentimes, all that's needed to convert a bench-warmer into a star player is the right coaching, where leadership outlines specific goals for athletes to achieve to get game time--jump 24 inches, sprint 40 yards in under five seconds, etc.--then plays those athletes during games upon reaching the benchmarks.

If people don't engage the way you need them to, it's possible that they've simply lost hope that anything they do will improve their condition now, tomorrow, or longer term. That means you need to take measures to rekindle their hope and to do so genuinely. One effective means is by utilizing a mechanism called The Transparent Career Ladder, a reward system consisting of achievement-based benchmarks that lead your organization and its people to desired outcomes. For our purposes here, you will not build the ladder, but instead you will learn some specific steps you can take based on its concept of aligning organizational desired outcomes with personal achievement.

Your aim is to take everyone off the imaginary treadmill they feel they're on, and allow their daily activities to lead them to a desirable destination. This will require you to balance the needs of the organization with the aspirations of your staffers. What do you really need for the organization, what skills should people possess, how can those who want to be promoted succeed, and how do you cultivate the people who don't have the skills--say moving them to another area where they can win--without demoralizing them? One of your cashiers may never aspire to become a manager, but he or she could be faster at ringing people out or become cross trained to win service awards so that they, too, are aware of their value to the organization and understand what they need to do to move forward. Once everyone understands how this win-win mechanism works, you will see improvement from both the people who want to rise to higher-level positions and



those who want to stay at their current position.

Here are the steps you can take to better engage your staff.

1. **Know your people.** Listen to what they're saying, watch where performance has been lagging, and try to understand where your pockets of problems exist. Talk to trusted team members who might be better tuned into the needs of your staff than you. These people could be members of your management team, or they might be front-line workers who typically aren't brought to the decision-making table. The information you gather at this stage will help you understand how you can be a better leader, what you can do to help support your staffers' successes, and what rewards you will build into your program of achievement.
2. **Assess your organization's resources to determine what types of pay raises, benefits, or other rewards you can give out to people who are motivated.** If you have been making cutbacks over a period of time and sense that people are burnt out from too much "doing more with less," investigate technologies and procedures that you can put into place to help your people find on-the-job success. This is an especially important measure whether the economy is good or bad and whether your firm is already profitable or needs to become so. Keep in mind that not everyone is motivated by money or position; some people just want to come to work, do a good job, and not run into hassles all day.
3. **Take a look at what your organization truly needs from its people so that the benchmarks you announce later are tied to strategy, tactics, and your organization's desired outcomes.** Although sales milestones are common, look everywhere throughout your organization for where it needs improvements: faster order entry, quicker turnaround time, fewer customer complaints, higher funding, and so on. Then be specific about what your staff members need to accomplish. Be sure to include all needed participants, such as individuals, departments, external stakeholders, etc. So you might say, "The accounting department must reduce its billing-error rate from its current 12% to 6% or less in six months."
4. **Create an achievement plan, complete with specific benchmarks and rewards that you can deliver over a predetermined time line, say month by month or annual period.** Study your financial reports, look at your competitive intelligence data, forecast market changes, consider new products and services, and any other challenges and opportunities that could have a potential impact on the rewards you will promise your people. Above all else, you must be able to follow through on your promises.
5. **Bring your people on board by explaining the benchmarks and the rewards you promise to deliver to them.** Many managers find that they can maintain a level of interest from their people if they set times with their staffers to monitor progress.

For the next few moments, put yourself in the shoes of one of your staff members who is currently "unengaged." What are your days like now? What would you like them to be? Do you know what you need to do to bridge the gap between your current status and your dreams? Have you been told that you'll need to work for a minimum amount of time to be considered for a promotion? Can you tell me what you need to know and how well you need to perform? Maybe you've been waiting for your supervisor, the person who holds the key to reaching your future

aspirations, to give you a project or outline a program, just so that you can show him or her how you can ace whatever challenge is tossed your way. Yet, over a period of time, if those challenges and rewards are never available to you, how motivated and engaged would you be?

Now picture yourself as the same staff member, but you've been given the benchmarks for successful advancement within your organization. You now know that you must have a certain attendance record, you must take two courses, and you need to work on a successful project as a co-leader. The project must come in on time and on budget. If that's all it would take, you may take the course during the summer and you'd put in all the effort you can to win at the new project you'd been assigned. If you succeed you'd be given a chance at managing a small group of people as an assistant. Obviously, the benchmarks ultimately need to develop skills, demonstrate responsibility, foster thinking, and otherwise prepare you for the position, but you can see how the scenario changes and how hopeful you can feel knowing exactly what is expected of you.

The next time you suspect that the morale dip in your organization is coming from your staff being pushed too far, take the matter into your own hands quickly. Remember that oftentimes, when the present isn't as manageable as your staffers would like, you can use the concept of The Transparent Career Ladder to bring the hope of a brighter future into view, pick up their spirits, and create a win-win situation for both your people and your organization. If you can't see a brighter future, then how can they?

Dan,
This is a followup to my call earlier today. Just to catch everyone else up. After the licensee completed the first sequence (100) of Pass 11, they started to have indications from the acoustic monitors installed on Bay 5-6. Bay 5-6 contains the two transfer tubes from the spent fuel pool to the refueling cavity inside containment. The noise started in the vicinity of the just previously tensioned tendon (64H41). As sensed by the acoustic monitors, the noise signature moved down to the lower RB elevations in the Aux building. The 3 embedded strain gages in that bay indicated an upward trend then lost their signal. The worker on the roof of the RB heard what sounded like "popping corn." Other workers heard what they characterized as "welds breaking". Jon Franke (SVP) called me to let me

know of the issue. Per Franke, they called in their laser scanning personnel on contract to do a laser scan inside the RB. The last laser scan was after Pass 10 just prior to doing sequence 100. They are also calling in the impulse response people to perform IR testing.

There is no indication of any problems with the spent fuel pool integrity. The transfer tubes are isolated from the pool. I walked down bay 5-6 and didn't find any cracking on that bay that is obvious.

More to follow.

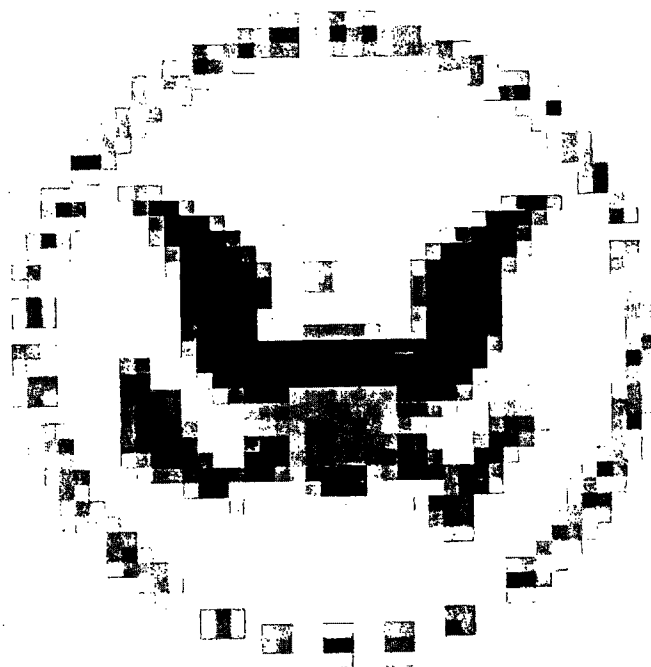

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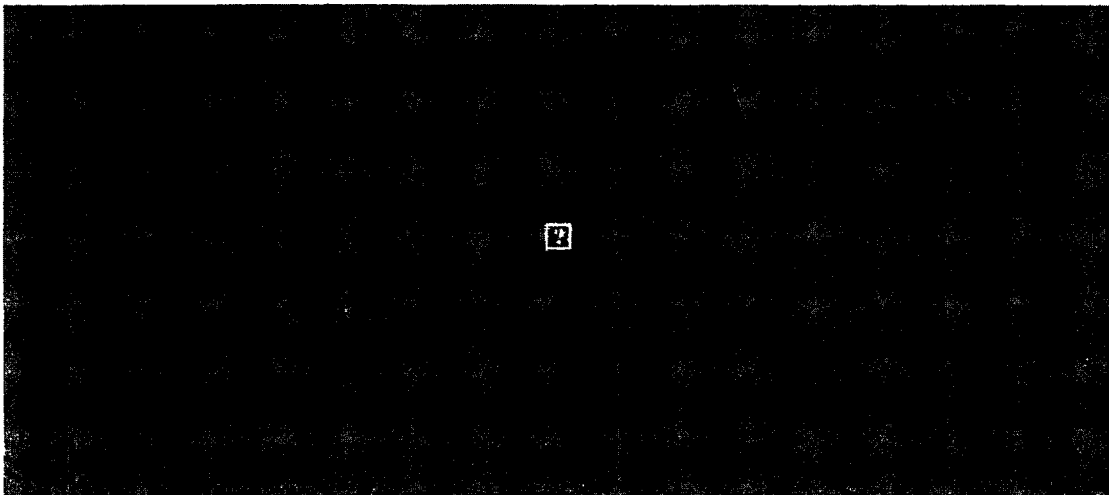

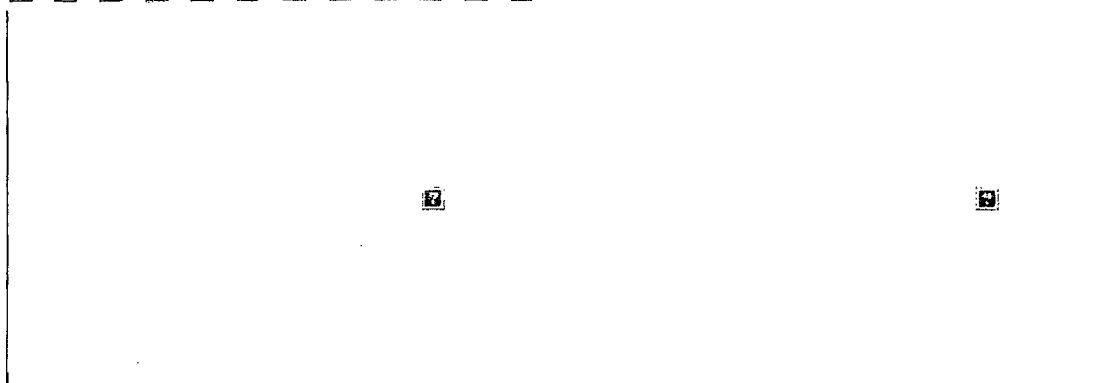

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All things are never equal.

You've most likely heard someone make the remark, "All things being equal." Maybe you've even said it yourself, but I caution you to really consider what is being said. In the real world, all things are never equal. No two companies are identical, no two operations work the same, and even "same" products differ, for instance, in warehouse locations, cash flow and credit terms, reward programs, brand identity, or other factors. You will serve your organization better if you can see the differentiating factors that come into play when you're strategizing and forecasting its future. Try to avoid solving any challenge from the standpoint that "all things are equal," and instead be sure that you're considering realistic conditions that could "make" or "break" the achievement of desired outcomes.

Leading Your Team up a Ladder of Hope

Over the past three years, Sam, a manager who heads a 240-person business unit in a successful North American company, has seen a steady decline in staff morale, where team members seem increasingly indifferent to meeting organizational goals, even though the organization is hitting sales marks and doing more with less. He senses that it could be only a matter of time before some staffers jump ship and find jobs elsewhere, despite his efforts to focus on better communication and education to keep them productive during rocky economic times. So what is really happening and how can Sam and leaders like him turn the tide?

Certainly, our problematic economies of late were bound to play a role in workers' apathy. However, even multi-national firms and small businesses alike who have been prosperous from 2008 to the present have taken measures that have ultimately pushed employees to work harder and for longer hours, without the pay raises, bonuses, and benefits that thwart retention issues, burnout, and in many

instances, lower productivity and output. Under these types of circumstances, your well-intentioned efforts to "improve communication" and "provide more education" aren't likely to motivate anyone to engage more. In fact, they can have the opposite effect.

When your staffers already feel overwhelmed and under-compensated, they don't want to give more without getting something back. Your aim to help can be perceived as yet another expectation of them to perform for the organization without any personal gain--financial or otherwise. They don't want to be forced to pry themselves away from the ever-growing pile of work they already have so that they can attend meetings to share their thoughts and feelings with you...especially if you're not able to alleviate the work load and offer some type of reward. In other words, if they can't find their personal payoff, they'll show up and do what they have to, but they won't be looking for new ways to contribute value to your organization.

The situation isn't much different than dealing with an athletic team's B squad, the group of people who are not "starters" and who rarely expect much (if any) play time during games. They have lost their motivation to excel over time, because try as they might to perform for their coaches, their efforts have been ignored and unrewarded. Oftentimes, all that's needed to convert a bench-warmer into a star player is the right coaching, where leadership outlines specific goals for athletes to achieve to get game time--jump 24 inches, sprint 40 yards in under five seconds, etc.--then plays those athletes during games upon reaching the benchmarks.

If people don't engage the way you need them to, it's possible that they've simply lost hope that anything they do will improve their condition now, tomorrow, or longer term. That means you need to take measures to rekindle their hope and to do so genuinely. One effective means is by utilizing a mechanism called The Transparent Career Ladder, a reward system consisting of achievement-based benchmarks that lead your organization and its people to desired outcomes. For our purposes here, you will not build the ladder, but instead you will learn some specific steps you can take based on its concept of aligning organizational desired outcomes with personal achievement.

Your aim is to take everyone off the imaginary treadmill they feel they're on, and allow their daily activities to lead them to a desirable destination. This will require you to balance the needs of the organization with the aspirations of your staffers. What do you really need for the organization, what skills should people possess, how can those who want to be promoted succeed, and how do you cultivate the people who don't have the skills--say moving them to another area where they can win--without demoralizing them? One of your cashiers may never aspire to become a manager, but he or she could be faster at ringing people out or become cross trained to win service awards so that they, too, are aware of their value to the organization and understand what they need to do to move forward. Once everyone understands how this win-win mechanism works, you will see improvement from both the people who want to rise to higher-level positions and those who want to stay at their current position.

Here are the steps you can take to better engage your staff.

1. **Know your people.** Listen to what they're saying, watch where performance has been lagging, and try to understand where your pockets of problems exist. Talk to trusted team members who might be better tuned into the needs of your staff than you. These people could be members of your management team, or they might be front-line workers who typically aren't

brought to the decision-making table. The information you gather at this stage will help you understand how you can be a better leader, what you can do to help support your staffers' successes, and what rewards you will build into your program of achievement.

2. **Assess your organization's resources to determine what types of pay raises, benefits, or other rewards you can give out to people who are motivated.** If you have been making cutbacks over a period of time and sense that people are burnt out from too much "doing more with less," investigate technologies and procedures that you can put into place to help your people find on-the-job success. This is an especially important measure whether the economy is good or bad and whether your firm is already profitable or needs to become so. Keep in mind that not everyone is motivated by money or position; some people just want to come to work, do a good job, and not run into hassles all day.
3. **Take a look at what your organization truly needs from its people so that the benchmarks you announce later are tied to strategy, tactics, and your organization's desired outcomes.** Although sales milestones are common, look everywhere throughout your organization for where it needs improvements: faster order entry, quicker turnaround time, fewer customer complaints, higher funding, and so on. Then be specific about what your staff members need to accomplish. Be sure to include all needed participants, such as individuals, departments, external stakeholders, etc. So you might say, "The accounting department must reduce its billing-error rate from its current 12% to 6% or less in six months."
4. **Create an achievement plan, complete with specific benchmarks and rewards that you can deliver over a predetermined time line, say month by month or annual period.** Study your financial reports, look at your competitive intelligence data, forecast market changes, consider new products and services, and any other challenges and opportunities that could have a potential impact on the rewards you will promise your people. Above all else, you must be able to follow through on your promises.
5. **Bring your people on board by explaining the benchmarks and the rewards you promise to deliver to them.** Many managers find that they can maintain a level of interest from their people if they set times with their staffers to monitor progress.

For the next few moments, put yourself in the shoes of one of your staff members who is currently "unengaged." What are your days like now? What would you like them to be? Do you know what you need to do to bridge the gap between your current status and your dreams? Have you been told that you'll need to work for a minimum amount of time to be considered for a promotion? Can you tell me what you need to know and how well you need to perform? Maybe you've been waiting for your supervisor, the person who holds the key to reaching your future aspirations, to give you a project or outline a program, just so that you can show him or her how you can ace whatever challenge is tossed your way. Yet, over a period of time, if those challenges and rewards are never available to you, how motivated and engaged would you be?

Now picture yourself as the same staff member, but you've been given the benchmarks for successful advancement within your organization. You now know that you must have a certain attendance record, you must take two courses, and you need to work on a successful project as a co-leader. The project must come in on time and on budget. If that's all it would take, you may take the course during the summer and you'd put in all the effort you can to win at the new project you'd been assigned. If you succeed you'd be given a chance at managing a small group of people as an assistant. Obviously, the benchmarks ultimately need to develop skills, demonstrate responsibility, foster thinking, and otherwise prepare you for the position, but you can see how the scenario changes and how hopeful you can feel knowing exactly what is expected of you.

The next time you suspect that the morale dip in your organization is coming from your staff being pushed too far, take the matter into your own hands quickly. Remember that oftentimes, when the present isn't as manageable as your staffers would like, you can use the concept of The Transparent Career Ladder to bring the hope of a brighter future into view, pick up their spirits, and create a win-win situation for both your people and your organization. If you can't see a brighter future, then how can they?

SUBJECT: LICENSING, INSPECTION, AND ENFORCEMENT PROGRAMS
REVIEW FOR STORAGE AND TRANSPORTATION

The purpose of this email is to inform you that the Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards is performing a self assessment to identify and implement regulatory and process improvements to the Agency's spent fuel storage and transportation inspection program and to seek your support for the project. This self assessment is led by the Division of High Level Waste Repository Safety and will consider the agency's two decades of licensing and oversight experience with dry cask storage and transportation systems, vendors, certificate holders and licensees. A description of this effort can be found in the attached Staff Requirements - COMSECY-10-0007, COMSECY-10-0007, and project Charter.

A staff Working Group (WG) is being formed that will perform a comprehensive review of the existing licensing, inspection, and enforcement programs. A staff Consulting Group (CG) is also being formed to complement the WG but it will not require as much time and will be task specific. The WG and CG will systematically review relevant rules, standards, guidance, procedures, and internal processes used to conduct licensing, inspection, and enforcement of spent nuclear fuel storage and transportation and radioactive materials transportation to identify efficiency and effectiveness improvements. Concurrent with the inspection process review, the WG will develop guidance on inspecting aging management programs at independent spent fuel storage installations with renewed license terms. The staff has targeted completion of the licensing, inspection, and enforcement review with identification of recommended process improvements by 4Q FY 2011.

I believe that to be as effective as possible, the WG and CG should include members that are experienced in other Agency oversight programs, such as NRR's Reactor Oversight Process and vendor inspection programs conducted by NRO, FCSS, and FSME. To that end, I am seeking both program office and regional perspectives to aid in achieving the best possible outcome. Our initial estimate of the level of effort for CG members is approximately 40 hours to complete the review. Additional time will be required of WG members to perform the detailed review. After the WG and CG members are designated the Project Manager, Thomas Matula, will provide task assignments and charge numbers to team members.

Please contact Thomas Matula (Thomas.Matula@nrc.gov) and provide him with the names of your representatives for the WG/CG as listed in the Charter. We will then arrange for a kickoff meeting in the near future to provide you with additional background information on this project. Thank you for your cooperation and assistance.

CHARTER

March 15, 2011

1.0 Background

On December 6, 2010, the Commission issued "Staff Requirements – COMSECY-10-0007 – Project Plan for Regulatory Program Review to Support Extended Storage and Transportation of Spent Nuclear Fuel." The staff developed that project plan in response to staff requirements memorandum (SRM) COMDEK-09-0001, "Revisiting the Paradigm for Spent Fuel Storage and Transportation Regulatory Programs." In the Staff Requirements – COMSECY-10-0007 the Commission approved several initiatives regarding storage and transportation.

2.0 Scope

The staff will review the licensing, inspection, and enforcement programs for storage and transportation activities conducted under the requirements of 10 CFR Parts 71 and 72. The purpose of this review is to identify improvements to increase efficiency and effectiveness of the licensing, inspection, and enforcement programs. The staff has targeted completion of the review with identification of recommended process improvements by 4Q FY 2011. The team members comprise a Steering Committee (SC), staff Working Group (WG), and staff Consulting Group (CG) as identified in Section 6.0. Our initial assessment of the level of effort for CG members is approximately 40 hours to complete the review. Additional time will be required of WG members to perform the detailed review. After the WG and CG members are designated the Project Manager will provide task assignments and charge numbers to team members. This Charter will be revised, as appropriate, to keep the information current, maintain proper focus, and ensure that meaningful outcomes are achieved.

3.0 Tasks

The tasks of the Licensing, Inspection, and Enforcement Programs Review are:

- Task 1: Identify improvements to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of inspection and enforcement programs, both as documented and as implemented
- Task 2: Identify improvements through integrating technical review, licensing, and inspection activities to increase efficiency and effectiveness of the inspection process
- Task 3: Assess the inspection and enforcement oversight of aging management plans
- Task 4: Implement a communication plan that will promote participation of stakeholders in this review

4.0 Task Descriptions

4.1 Task 1: Inspection and Enforcement Programs Review

The goal of this task is to review the inspection and enforcement programs for storage and transportation conducted under the requirements of 10 CFR Parts 71 and 72 to identify efficiency and effectiveness improvements. There are two phases to completing this task. In Phase 1 the staff will review the inspection and enforcement programs as they are documented. Staff will:

- Perform a comprehensive review of the NRC inspection manual, enforcement policy, and associated procedures and guidance documents for fabricators, certificate holders, and licensees for storage and transportation activities
- Benchmark the existing storage and transportation oversight program against other NRC inspection and enforcement programs
- Identify inconsistencies, missing information, or other issues in the inspection and enforcement documents and recommend actions that are risk-informed and performance-based, as appropriate
- Assess and recommend how inspection findings, information from site loading campaigns, emergent technical issues, and operating experience are combined, managed, and addressed using the licensing, inspection, enforcement, and reactor oversight programs
- Identify good practices and assure that they are carried forward
- Recommend immediate implementation of any significant changes that can be made in advance of completing the full program review

In Phase 2 the staff will review the inspection and enforcement programs as they are implemented. Staff will:

- Consult with NRC personnel having knowledge and experience in performing inspection and enforcement activities for fabricators, certificate holders, and licensees to obtain input on implementing inspection programs
- Identify inconsistencies, errors, or other issues in performing inspection and enforcement activities and identify actions that are risk-informed and performance-based, as appropriate
- Assess resource utilization by determining the estimated and actual level of effort necessary to conduct inspection activities
- Identify good practices and assure that they are carried forward
- Recommend immediate implementation of any significant changes that can be made in advance of completing the full program review

4.2 Task 2: Licensing and Inspection Integration

The goal of this task is to identify areas where the technical review, licensing, and inspection activities can be integrated to improve efficiency and effectiveness. To accomplish this task the staff will:

- Perform a comprehensive assessment of procedures and guidance documents regarding technical review, licensing, and inspection activities to identify areas to integrate between the organizations
- Consult with members of the technical review, licensing, and inspection organizations to identify areas for possible integration
- Evaluate how the inspection process should be adjusted to identify technical- and quality-related issues specified in licensee's applications, technical specifications, and Certificates of Compliance
- Assure that appropriate technical- and quality-related issues identified in the licensing process are addressed by qualified staff during the inspection process
- Evaluate whether adjustments should be made to the licensing process in response to licensee performance findings identified during inspections
- Identify good practices and assure that they are carried forward
- Assess if changes are necessary to key regulatory and licensing documents such as the inspection manual and the enforcement policy
- Examine how NRC inspects and enforces licensee change authority and quality assurance
- Recommend immediate implementation of any significant changes that can be made in advance of completing the full program review
- Identify integration changes to improve the effectiveness of licensing and inspection activities that are risk-informed and performance-based, as appropriate

4.3 Task 3: Aging Management Inspection

The goal of this task is to develop recommendations for inspecting aging management programs at Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installations. The staff will:

- Review current inspection and enforcement guidance to assess applicability to the inspection and enforcement of aging management plans associated with the 40-year license renewals
- Consult with inspection staff from other NRC Offices and the Regions to determine how best to perform effective aging management inspection and enforcement
- Identify actions for effective inspection and enforcement of aging management activities that are risk-informed and performance-based, as appropriate

4.4 Task 4: Communication Plan

The goal of this task is to actively seek input and feedback from stakeholders during the development and implementation of any changes made to inspection and enforcement programs. To facilitate effective communication with stakeholders, NRC staff will:

- Develop and align key messages for the inspection and enforcement programs
- Identify key target audiences for input/feedback
- Develop appropriate communication tools to coordinate the timely and effective dissemination of information with stakeholders and the public
- Provide opportunities that encourage stakeholders to provide input/feedback on evolving issues

NRC staff's outreach efforts will also seek to maintain and leverage existing external networks that have been developed for spent fuel transportation and storage.

5.0 Performance Measures

The staff will establish performance measures to ensure the achievement of the desired outcomes as described in this Charter. The staff will:

- Consult with inspection personnel from NRC headquarters to capture baseline inspection performance information for reference
- Assure that future activities performed in licensing, inspection, and enforcement programs are tracked to measure effectiveness and efficiency improvements resulting from changes made to associated procedures
- Refine the performance measures during execution of the tasks described in this Charter, as appropriate

- Interact with internal and external stakeholders regarding the Review

- Ensure effective interdivision and interoffice coordination and integration on emerging issues
- Identify and assign necessary resources to complete tasks
- Assign and delete activities, and adjust schedules based on available resources and changes in priorities

The WG comprises a Project Manager and technical representatives to serve as the primary staff responsible for completing review tasks. The responsibilities of the WG are:

- Prepare adequately for each meeting for maximum contribution
- Provide quality and timely documentation as required
- Complete tasks as assigned by the PM
- Monitor task progress and inform the PM of any deviations

- Update the SC and PM on the progress of the review
- Identify updates to the review and revise the review plan as directed by the PM

The CG comprises personnel from other NRC Offices and the Regions who are experienced and knowledgeable in spent fuel storage and transportation or other oversight programs. Members of the CG will be called upon, as needed, for specific activities in completing certain tasks. Therefore, the time requirement for CG members will be significantly less than that required of the WG members. The primary responsibilities of the CG are:

- Prepare adequately for each meeting for maximum contribution
- Provide quality and timely documentation as required
- Provide input and perspective to the team based on their knowledge and experience
- Complete review assignments as assigned by the PM
- Update the PM on the progress of the review

Meetings with the SC, WG, and CG will be scheduled and coordinated by the PM or his designated representative. Meetings will be held by teleconference for those not located at NRC Headquarters to reduce travel time and expenses. The overall plan for the Review is available through the PM.

Failure to Recognize the Emergency Service Water Piping Supports Did Not Meet Seismic Category 1 Design Basis Requirements

During a Component Design Bases Inspection, the inspectors conducted a plant walkdown and noted in both essential service water (ESW) trains, the ESW piping stanchion supports were not in contact with their baseplates. The supports were located on the discharge side of their respective ESW pumps near the boundary of safety and non-safety-related piping. The gaps between the supports and the floor baseplates were about ¼ inch. These supports were classified seismic Category 1 because their function was to protect the safety-related piping, which provides the required cooling water to the emergency diesel generators.

Upon further review, the inspectors determined that the licensee had previously identified this condition on at least three separate occasions. On February 3, 2003, the licensee documented the discovery of gaps at the mentioned supports in their CAP. The licensee concluded the piping was operable even if the supports were not functional. The licensee repaired the supports by removing the gaps to restore the piping and associated supports to within ASME Code allowables. On April 28, 2008, the licensee documented the discovery of gaps at the same location. On this occasion, the licensee referred to the evaluation conducted in 2003 and determined that no corrective actions were necessary because the piping had been determined to be operable. On February 26, 2009, the licensee, again, documented the rediscovery of the gaps and noted that the condition was previously evaluated in 2003 and 2008. The inspectors also noted that in 2003 the licensee classified the issue as a condition adverse to quality, while in 2008 and 2009 the licensee did not classified the issues as a condition adverse to quality. As such, in 2008 and 2009 the licensee did not assign any corrective actions to restore compliance until challenged by the inspectors.

This finding illustrates the importance of plant walkdowns to verify that design documents (e.g., calculations and analysis) reflect the actual conditions of systems and components. In addition, the finding demonstrates the importance of understanding the history of the systems and components under review and requirements for the licensee to correct conditions adverse to quality for safety-related structures, systems, and components. In this example, the history of the system was crucial in the inspectors understanding of both the performance deficiency and the casual factors (05000263/2009007-02). Contact Néstor J. Failure to Evaluate the Adequacy of Voltage for Safety-Related Equipment

In May 2000 the licensee performed a motor control center (MCC) control circuit voltage drop calculation and determined that for four safety-related loads, the control circuit contactors did not have adequate voltage for pick up under accident conditions. In order to further evaluate these failed circuits the licensee performed another calculation. The results of this calculation again indicated the four safety-related loads did not have sufficient voltage for pick up under accident conditions. Subsequently, in 2001 the licensee performed a General Condition Report (GEN) 200186598 to support the operability of these four circuits that failed the maximum acceptable voltage drop criteria of the calculation. The operability evaluation was based on test data obtained between 1996 and 2001, which demonstrated a very small margin existed for these components.

During a self-assessment in preparation for the 2010 CDBI, the licensee identified concerns regarding the operability evaluation that was performed as part of GEN 2001186598. Specifically, the licensee did not consider the impact of design basis accident temperatures and voltage variations on the operability of the 480 V motor control center (MCC) starters/contactors with very low voltage margin. The licensee issued CAP 01219292.

During the CDBI, the inspectors noted that the licensee failed to address the concerns about the impact of design basis accident temperatures and voltage variations and, therefore, there was no assurance about the adequacy of voltage at the MCC for the contactors to pick up under design basis accident conditions. The inspectors questioned the viability of the operability determination and as a result the licensee issued CAP 01243406 to re-evaluate the operability of the four MCC control circuits and determined one circuit (associated with the 22 shield building ventilation recirculation fan) did not pass the acceptance criteria for maximum acceptable voltage drop. The licensee performed an operability recommendation OPR 01 for this circuit and declared the circuit as operable but non-conforming as long as ambient temperature in the vicinity of MCC 2M2 remained below 114.62 °F.

The above discussion indicates the value of maintaining a questioning attitude, independently verifying the licensee's design inputs, verifying the validity of calculations, ensuring issues identified by the licensee were adequately addressed and challenging the licensee on the adequacy of their evaluations and responses provided. Steve Dolley here said he has contacted you about us talking with a BWR expert at NRC. I'm assigned to write the story, so want to check with you about the status of that inquiry. My deadline is 5pm, but as you can imagine, I do need time to digest and write this very technical story, so if you could respond as soon as possible, I'll appreciate it greatly!

I have very specific technical questions. I was told: The Nuclear Regulatory Commission has analyzed the Mark I containment design in great detail. The NRC analysis found that the BWR Mark I risk was dominated by two scenarios: station blackout and anticipated transient without scram. The NRC subsequently promulgated regulations for both of these sequences as well as other actions to reduce the probability.

So I want to know exactly what the NRC analysis found and what regulations NRC installed to mitigate the risk as a result of the analysis. I will be in a meeting in the next half an hour or so, so could you call me at my cell phone (b)(6) during that period?

SUBJECT: CHARTER FOR SPECIAL INSPECTION TO EVALUTE THE TURBINE
DRIVEN AUXILIARY FEEDWATER PUMP INADEQUATE BEARING
LUBRICATION AT THE CALLAWAY PLANT

In response to the discovery of inadequate Turbine Driven Auxiliary Feedwater Pump (TDAFW) bearing lubrication, a Special Inspection will be performed. You are hereby designated as the Special Inspection Team Leader. James Polickoski, NRR Project Manager, is designated as a team member. The Senior Reactor Analyst assigned to support the team is Mike Runyan. Laura Micewski, Project Engineer, is designated as a trainee for a developmental assignment.

A. Basis

On February 8, 2011, a sample of bearing oil from the TDAFW pump showed particulates in the oil. Upon further review, the licensee determined that the oil level was maintained at a level which did not allow proper lubrication of the pump bearing. The equipment likely had been in that configuration since the previous refueling outage, in June 2010.

A regional Senior Reactor Analyst (SRA) estimated the Maximum Conditional Core Damage Probability for this issue to be 2.1×10^{-5} /year, which is in the overlap region between a special inspection and an augmented inspection team. Based on available information, the NRC staff recommended performance of a special inspection. The special inspection activities will include information gathering to determine whether an augmented inspection is warranted, as well as inspections to understand the extent of condition, past operability, and to assess the adequacy of the licensee's corrective actions.

B. Scope

The team will address the following:

1. Throughout the inspection coordinate with the regional SRA to ensure the NRC response to the event is consistent with the potential safety significance.
2. Develop a complete sequence of events related to the discovery of the inadequate bearing lubrication and follow-up actions taken by the licensee.
3. Review operating experience involving bearing lubrication, and evaluate actions implemented at Callaway as a result of operating experience.
4. Review the current status of the licensee's root cause analysis and determine if it is being conducted at a level of detail commensurate with the significance of the problem.
5. Review the potential cause or causes of any design deficiencies and/or operating practices that allowed the oil level to be maintained at a less than appropriate level. In this review, ascertain the role of the Quality Control Department during this critical maintenance task. Independently verify key assumptions and facts. Interviews with key personnel involved in the oil level adjustment should be conducted in this effort.
6. Determine if (a) the licensee's immediate corrective actions have corrected the problem, (b) the licensee has addressed the extent of condition and extent of cause for insufficient lubrication of safety systems, and (c) whether these actions are adequate to prevent recurrence. In particular, determine if any other pump bearings may be improperly lubricated by reviewing the set-up of their oil bubblers.
7. Review the licensee's compliance with the Technical Specifications.
8. Verify the licensee met the proper reporting requirements of 10 CFR 50.72 and 10 CFR 50.73. Also determine if the licensee has plans to issue a Licensee Event Report to document this issue.
9. Evaluate the potential for any generic issues related to the discovery of the inadequate lubrication conditions and promptly communicate any potential generic issues to regional management.
10. In concert with the SRA, collect data as necessary to support a significance determination of issues.

C. Guidance

Inspection Procedure 93812, "Special Inspection," will be used during this inspection. The inspection should emphasize fact-finding in its review of the circumstance surrounding this event. It is not the responsibility of the team to examine the regulatory

process. Safety concerns identified that are not directly related to the event should be reported to the Region IV office for appropriate action.

The team will report to the site, conduct an entrance, and begin inspection no later than March 21, 2011. While onsite, you will provide daily status briefings to Region IV management, starting on Tuesday, March 22, 2011. Regional management will coordinate with the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation to ensure that all other parties are kept informed. The inspection results will be documented in Special Inspection Report 05000483/2011007. This report will be issued within 45 days of the completion of the inspection.

Results Achieved: The desired outcome was achieved. The U.S. was able to effectively present the U.S. approach to long-term operations (license renewal) and ensure that the approach was described throughout the booklet. This resulted in a balanced discussion in the booklet in terms of the two main approaches to long-term operation of nuclear power plants, one of which is the U.S. approach with the other being the periodic safety review approach. The Senior Task Group members continued to acknowledge the importance of describing the U.S. approach in the booklet to fully inform international regulators who will refer to the booklet.

Summary of Trip: The meeting was held from February 22-24, 2011. Besides the U.S., representatives from Belgium, Canada, Finland, France, India, Japan, Sweden, and the United Kingdom participated as well as an IAEA representative. During the meeting, representatives discussed and revised the framework, revised the content of the booklet, provided comments, and determined a path forward to finalize the booklet. NRC participation in this activity should be continued to ensure U.S. views are represented.

Pending Actions/Planned Next Steps for NRC: The U.S. was asked to provide certain additional input by March 11. A revised draft will be provided to the Senior Task Group for comment to support providing a draft to the CNRA by May 13, 2011, to support the CNRA June meeting. The booklet will be revised based on CNRA comments as well as perspectives from the NEA Forum on Long-term Operation on June 8, 2011, and presented to the CNRA at their December 2011 meeting for final endorsement.

This letter provides you the final significance determination of the preliminary White finding discussed in our previous communication dated February 11, 2011, which included the subject inspection report. The finding involved the failure to ensure that a flange connection on the upper lube oil cooler of the 2A diesel generator was correctly torqued, following maintenance. This led to the 2A diesel generator being required to be shut down when a significant oil leak developed during routine monthly surveillance testing on November 17, 2010.

In a telephone conversation with Mr. Eric Duncan, Chief, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Region III, Reactor Projects Branch 3, on February 18, 2011, Mr. Brad Adams, Byron Plant Manager, indicated that Exelon did not contest the characterization of the risk significance of this finding and that you declined your opportunity to discuss this issue in a Regulatory Conference or to provide a written response. Exelon later followed this verbal notification with a letter dated February 23, 2011.

After considering the information developed during the inspection, the NRC has concluded that the finding is appropriately characterized as White, a finding of low to moderate risk significance. According to NRC Inspection Manual Chapter (IMC) 0609, and as acknowledged in the February 23, 2011, letter, appeal rights only apply to those licensees that have either attended a Regulatory Conference or submitted a written response to the preliminary determination letter.

The NRC has also determined that the failure to have appropriate acceptance criteria to ensure that the flange connection on the upper lube oil cooler of the 2A diesel generator was correctly torqued during maintenance is a violation of Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations (10 CFR) Part 50, Appendix B, Criterion V, "Instructions, Procedures and Drawings," as cited in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). The circumstances surrounding the violation were described in detail in the subject inspection report. In accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy, the Notice is considered escalated enforcement action because it is associated with a White finding.

During a U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) inspection conducted from January 1 to February 7, 2011, a violation of NRC requirements was identified. In accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy, the violation is listed below:

Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations (10 CFR), Part 50, Appendix B, Criterion V, "Instructions, Procedures, and Drawings," states, in part, that instructions, procedures, or drawings shall include appropriate quantitative or qualitative acceptance criteria for determining that important activities have been satisfactorily accomplished. Work Order 1206254, "Clean Tube Side of Lube Oil Coolers," dated January 10, 2010, was a quality document that the licensee used to perform maintenance on the safety-related 2A diesel generator upper lube oil cooler. Technical Specification 3.8.1.b limiting condition for operation requires two diesel generators to be operable and capable of supplying the onsite Class 1E alternating current electrical power distribution system during Modes 1 through 4. Action Statement 3.8.1.B.5 requires, in part, that if one diesel generator is inoperable, then it must be restored to operable within 14 days and 3.8.1.G requires, in part, that if the required action for 3.8.1.B.5 was not met, then the plant was to be in Mode 3 within 6 hours and Mode 5 within 36 hours.

Contrary to the above, Work Order 1206254 did not contain appropriate quantitative or qualitative acceptance criteria to ensure upper lube oil cooler operability prior to returning the 2A diesel generator to service on January 17, 2010. Specifically, work order package 1206254 did not contain a final torque verification to ensure that the 2A diesel generator upper lube oil cooler spool piece connections were torqued to the required values. As a result, the torqued spool piece flange connection to the upper lube oil cooler did not meet the minimum torque ranges specified in the work order, and, subsequently, during routine testing on November 17, 2010, the flange connection on the 2A diesel generator upper lube oil cooler failed. The 2A diesel generator was inoperable since January 17, 2010, and, because the licensee was not aware of the inoperability, the allowed outage time in Action Statement 3.8.1.B.5 of 14 days was exceeded and the conditions of 3.8.1.G were not followed.

This violation is associated with a White Significance Determination Process finding.

The NRC has concluded that information regarding the reason for the violation, the corrective actions taken and planned to be taken to correct the violation and prevent recurrence, and the date when full compliance was achieved, is already adequately addressed on the docket in Inspection Report No. 05000455/2011011. However, you are required to submit a written statement or explanation pursuant to 10 CFR 2.201 if the description therein does not accurately reflect your corrective actions or your position. The Committee on Oversight and Government Reform is conducting an investigation into the termination of the Yucca Mountain Project. In particular, the recent actions of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) in connection with the Department of Energy's motion to withdraw the license application require further explanation.

The Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982 (NWPAct), established the authority of the federal government, specifically the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), to site, construct and operate a permanent geologic repository for the nation's spent nuclear fuel (SNF) and high level waste (HLW). In 1987, Congress amended the NWPAct, designating Yucca Mountain in Nevada as the only site available for consideration.

In 2002, pursuant to the process defined by the NWPAct, Congress and the President approved the recommendation of the Secretary of Energy to construct a repository at Yucca Mountain. In June 2008, DOE submitted a license application to the NRC to construct and operate the proposed repository. Yet, your actions and those of current Energy Secretary Steven Chu appear to undermine congressional intent.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit stated in a 2004 opinion that "Congress has settled the matter, and we, no less than the parties, are bound by its decision."¹ On March 3, 2010, however, the Department of Energy filed a motion to withdraw the license application with prejudice in an attempt to ensure the Yucca Mountain Project could never be resurrected.² Affected parties challenged the legality of this action, and in June 2010, the NRC's Atomic Safety and Licensing Board (ASLB) unanimously denied DOE's motion, citing a lack of authority.³

Eight months later, the Commission has still not decided whether to review the ASLB's decision. It has come to this Committee's attention that Commissioners William Ostendorff, Kristine Svinicki, and William Magwood filed their "preliminary" votes with the Secretary of the Commission last summer.⁴ Although you filed your vote last summer as well, you delayed the resolution of this matter by later withdrawing your vote.⁵ You proceeded to continue solitary deliberations until after the start of the new fiscal year and resubmitted your vote on October 29, 2010.⁶ Despite having all preliminary votes submitted more than four months ago, and the enormous significance of the Commission's decision in this matter, you have failed to schedule an affirmation session to ratify those votes. Nevertheless, until the affirmation session is held, the ASLB's determination that the application cannot be withdrawn continues to stand.

While delaying a final vote on the ASLB decision, you instructed staff to proceed with an "orderly closure" of the NRC's license application review.⁷ NRC staff are following your instruction "to continue [the staff's] activities on the Yucca Mountain license application" in accordance with the "Commission's decisions on the fiscal year 2011 budget request" during the Continuing Resolution, which, by your interpretation, dictates termination of the review.⁸ In response to congressional and your fellow commissioners' questions about your instruction to the NRC staff,⁹ you have stated that neither the FY 2010 Appropriations Act and associated committee reports nor the FY 2011 Continuing Resolution provided you with any express direction on how to expend taxpayer dollars on Yucca Mountain activities in FY 2011.¹⁰ Your fellow commissioners¹¹ and a former NRC Chairman¹² have expressed their strong disagreement with this position publicly.

If you insist the staff continue down this path, I would expect the "orderly closure" you requested to include a complete accounting of the staff's work to date. Part of this effort would logically be the public release of Volume III of the Safety Evaluation Report, which contains the conclusions of the NRC staff regarding the technical merits of

the license application. Thus far, the NRC has only released a redacted, pre-decisional version of the document in response to a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request.¹³ The document's pre-decisional state directly contradicts Commissioner Ostendorff's October 27, 2010, letter informing Rep. Doc Hastings "on July 15, 2010, Volume III was transmitted to the Director.... [f]or concurrence and authorization to publish."¹⁴ Furthermore, in the words of the ASLB, none of the evidence provided "comports with the Staff's characterization of SER Volume 3 being a preliminary draft."¹⁵

Shortly after taking office, President Obama pledged that "the public must be able to trust the science and scientific process informing public policy decisions."¹⁶ Likewise, as Chairman, you have stressed the importance of "conduct[ing] the public's work in an open and transparent manner."¹⁷ Unfortunately, your actions surrounding the termination of the Yucca Mountain Project fail to live up to this pledge.

In order to assist the Committee with its investigation, please provide the following information and documents:

1. A timeline of significant events related to the Commission's review of the ASLB's decision on DOE's motion to withdraw the license application, including but not limited to the following:
 - a. Filing of each Commissioner's vote.
 - b. Withdrawal of any Commissioner's vote.
 - c. Active deliberation or discussions between Commissioners or their staff.
2. Documents and communications, including e-mails, relating to the Commission's review of the ASLB's decision on DOE's motion to withdraw the license application.
3. Documents and communications, including e-mails, relating to reasons for the delay between the filing of the final Commissioner's vote and the scheduling of the affirmation session.
4. A timeline of all significant events related to the "orderly closure" of the High-Level Waste Program and the use of Nuclear Waste Fund resources

 8. A statement by each individual responsible for reviewing and signing Volume III of the SER specifying whether he/she received the document for final concurrence and whether and when he/she gave that concurrence.
 9. Documents and communications, including e-mails, related to the decision to develop a report separate from the SER to document the NRC staff's technical review activities completed to date.
 10. Volume III of the SER, in unredacted form.


The Committee on Oversight and Government Reform is the principal oversight committee of the House of Representatives and may at "any time" investigate "any matter" as set forth in House Rule X.

Responding to Committee Document Requests

1. In complying with this request, you should produce all responsive documents that are in your possession, custody, or control, whether held by you or your past or present agents, employees, and representatives acting on your behalf. You should also produce documents that you have a legal right to obtain, that you have a right to copy or to which you have access, as well as documents that you have placed in the temporary possession, custody, or control of any third party. Requested records, documents, data or information should not be destroyed, modified, removed, transferred or otherwise made inaccessible to the Committee.
2. In the event that any entity, organization or individual denoted in this request has been, or is also known by any other name than that herein denoted, the request shall be read also to include that alternative identification.
3. The Committee's preference is to receive documents in electronic form (i.e., CD, memory stick, or thumb drive) in lieu of paper productions.
4. Documents produced in electronic format should also be organized, identified, and indexed electronically.
5. Electronic document productions should be prepared according to the following standards:
 - (a) The production should consist of single page Tagged Image File ("TIF"), files accompanied by a Concordance-format load file, an Opticon reference file, and a file defining the fields and character lengths of the load file.
 - (b) Document numbers in the load file should match document Bates numbers and TIF file names.
 - (c) If the production is completed through a series of multiple partial productions, field names and file order in all load files should match.

6. Documents produced to the Committee should include an index describing the contents of the production. To the extent more than one CD, hard drive, memory stick, thumb drive, box or folder is produced, each CD, hard drive, memory stick, thumb drive, box or folder should contain an index describing its contents.
7. Documents produced in response to this request shall be produced together with copies of file labels, dividers or identifying markers with which they were associated when they were requested.
8. When you produce documents, you should identify the paragraph in the Committee's request to which the documents respond.
9. It shall not be a basis for refusal to produce documents that any other person or entity also possesses non-identical or identical copies of the same documents.
10. If any of the requested information is only reasonably available in machine-readable form (such as on a computer server, hard drive, or computer backup tape), you should consult with the Committee staff to determine the appropriate format in which to produce the information.
11. If compliance with the request cannot be made in full, compliance shall be made to the extent possible and shall include an explanation of why full compliance is not possible.
12. In the event that a document is withheld on the basis of privilege, provide a privilege log containing the following information concerning any such document: (a) the privilege asserted; (b) the type of document; (c) the general subject matter; (d) the date, author and addressee; and (e) the relationship of the author and addressee to each other.
13. If any document responsive to this request was, but no longer is, in your possession, custody, or control, identify the document (stating its date, author, subject and recipients) and explain the circumstances under which the document ceased to be in your possession, custody, or control.
14. If a date or other descriptive detail set forth in this request referring to a document is inaccurate, but the actual date or other descriptive detail is known to you or is otherwise apparent from the context of the request, you should produce all documents which would be responsive as if the date or other descriptive detail were correct.
15. The time period covered by this request is included in the attached request. To the extent a time period is not specified, produce relevant documents from January 1, 2009 to the present.
16. This request is continuing in nature and applies to any newly-discovered information. Any record, document, compilation of data or information, not produced because it has not been located or discovered by the return date, shall be produced immediately upon subsequent location or discovery.

17. All documents shall be Bates-stamped sequentially and produced sequentially.
18. Two sets of documents shall be delivered, one set to the Majority Staff and one set to the Minority Staff. When documents are produced to the Committee, production sets shall be delivered to the Majority Staff in Room 2157 of the Rayburn House Office Building and the Minority Staff in Room 2471 of the Rayburn House Office Building.
19. Upon completion of the document production, you should submit a written certification, signed by you or your counsel, stating that: (1) a diligent search has been completed of all documents in your possession, custody, or control which reasonably could contain responsive documents; and (2) all documents located during the search that are responsive have been produced to the Committee.

Definitions

1. The term "document" means any written, recorded, or graphic matter of any nature whatsoever, regardless of how recorded, and whether original or copy, including, but not limited to, the following: memoranda, reports, expense reports, books, manuals, instructions, financial reports, working papers, records, notes, letters, notices, confirmations, telegrams, receipts, appraisals, pamphlets, magazines, newspapers, prospectuses, inter-office and intra-office communications, electronic mail (e-mail), contracts, cables, notations of any type of conversation, telephone call, meeting or other communication, bulletins, printed matter, computer printouts, teletypes, invoices, transcripts, diaries, analyses, returns, summaries, minutes, bills, accounts, estimates, projections, comparisons, messages, correspondence, press releases, circulars, financial statements, reviews, opinions, offers, studies and investigations, questionnaires and surveys, and work sheets (and all drafts, preliminary versions, alterations, modifications, revisions, changes, and amendments of any of the foregoing, as well as any attachments or appendices thereto), and graphic or oral records or representations of any kind (including without limitation, photographs, charts, graphs, microfiche, microfilm, videotape, recordings and motion pictures), and electronic, mechanical, and electric records or representations of any kind (including, without limitation, tapes, cassettes, disks, and recordings) and other written, printed, typed, or other graphic or recorded matter of any kind or nature, however produced or reproduced, and whether preserved in writing, film, tape, disk, videotape or otherwise. 5. The term "identify," when used in a question about individuals, means to provide the following information: (a) the individual's complete name and title; and (b) the individual's business address and phone number.
6. The term "referring or relating," with respect to any given subject, means anything that constitutes, contains, embodies, reflects, identifies, states, refers to, deals with or is pertinent to that subject in any manner whatsoever.

Germany to shut down 7 reactors temporarily

BERLIN – Chancellor Angela Merkel says Germany will take seven of its 17 reactors offline for three months while the country reconsiders plans to extend the life of its nuclear power plants.

Merkel said Tuesday that Germany will temporarily shut down reactors that went into operation before the end of 1980, affecting seven reactors. The decision comes amid fears sparked by the crisis under way at Japan's tsunami-stricken nuclear power plant.

Merkel spoke after meeting with the governors of states that have nuclear power plants.

A previous government decided a decade ago to shut all 17 German nuclear plants by 2021, but Merkel's administration last year moved to extend their lives by an average 12 years. That decision was suspended for three months on Monday.

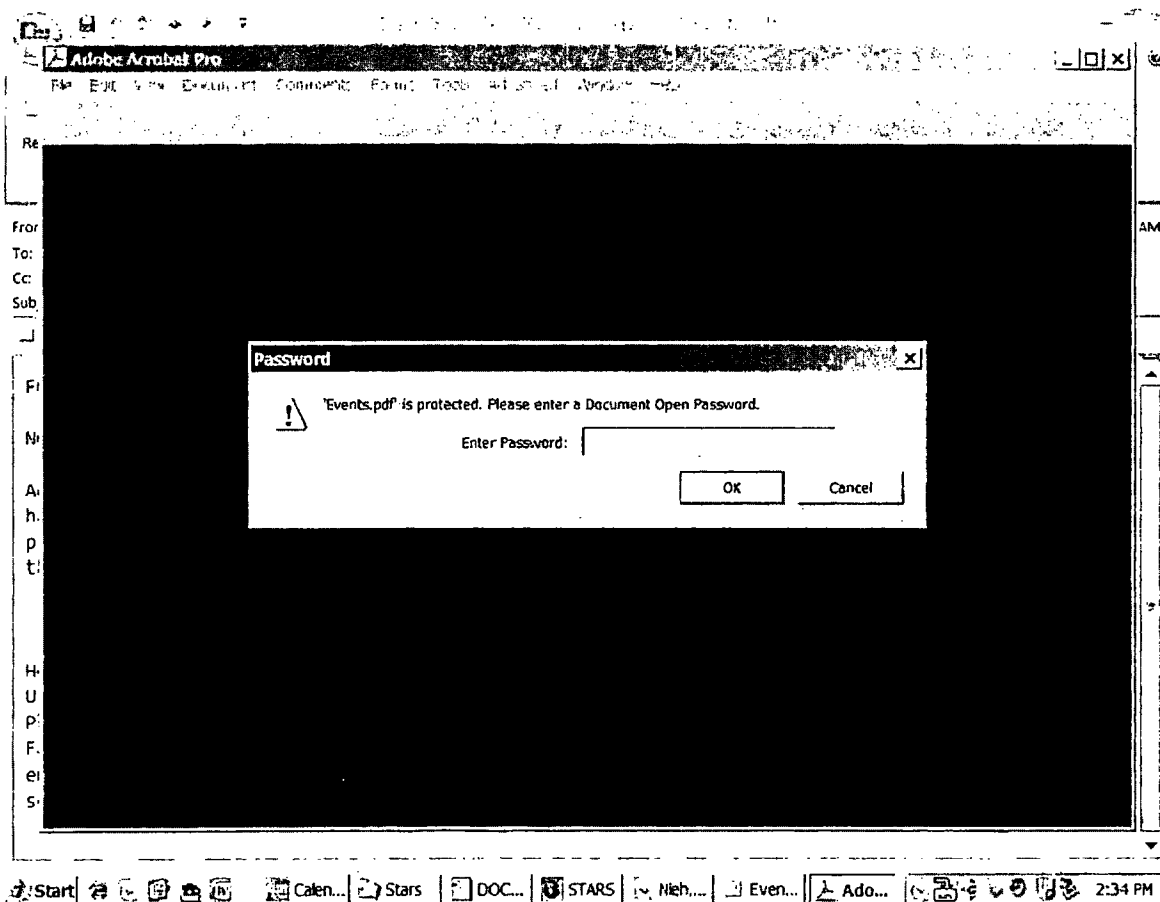

ADDITIONAL DELAMINATED CONTAINMENT CONCRETE DISCOVERED

"Crystal River Unit 3 is currently shutdown. Final tendon re-tensioning activities were being conducted following repair of delaminated (separated) concrete at the periphery of the containment wall. At approximately 1311 [EDT] on March 14, 2011, an indication was received from acoustic monitoring instrumentation located on the containment wall outside the previously repaired area. Re-tensioning activities were stopped and Plant Operations verified that there were no changes in plant parameters. Non-destructive examinations were initiated and preliminary indications are that there is delaminated concrete in the area identified by the acoustic monitoring. An assessment concluded that the containment continues to maintain the closure-pressure retaining capability required for Mode 5. There continues to be no threat to the public health and safety.

"Delaminated concrete at the periphery of the containment wall was created in late 2009 during the process of creating an opening in the structure to remove and replace the steam generators inside (Reference Event Report 45416). The unit was already shut down for refueling and maintenance at the time the damage was found and has remained shut down."

The extent of newly discovered delaminated has not yet been determined.

The licensee plans to make a press release.

The licensee has notified the NRC Resident Inspector and the Florida Public Service Commission.

"An Authorized User physician from the University of Michigan Department of Radiation Oncology planned two liver infusion treatments for a patient with unresectable hepatocellular carcinoma using Y-90 Theraspheres. As part of treatment preparation, an MRI was performed on the patient to determine the patient's liver segment volumes. Liver segment volumes are used in calculating the Y-90 activity needed to deliver the prescribed radiation dose to particular segments of the liver. The first treatment was to the right lobe and medial segment of the patient's liver and was performed on 12/15/2010. It proceeded without incident and in accordance with the written directive.

"The Authorized User physician scheduled a second separate treatment to the patient's left lobe to be performed on 3/9/2011. The Authorized User ordered a 74.4 Gy dose to the left lobe of the liver. The medical physicist calculated a corresponding dosage of 60.5 mCi of Y-90 to be infused into the left lobe of the liver.

"However, in arriving at the Y-90 activity needed, a medical physicist used the liver segment volumes for the right lobe and medial segment combined instead of that for the left lobe. The volume of the right lobe and medial segment is much larger than that for the left lobe. As a result, the Y-90 dosage of 60.5 mCi exceeded what was actually needed to deliver the prescribed dose of 74.4 Gy. The Y-90 was infused into to the left lobe on 3/9/2011 at approximately 10 [EST]. Based on the Authorized User's reassessment of the left lobe volume, the dose to the left lobe is calculated, post-administration, to be 159.4 Gy.

"The patient was notified of the event on 3/9/2011. The referring physician was also notified on the morning of 3/10/2011. The Authorized User physician has concluded that the elevated radiation dose to the patient's liver will not result in permanent medical damage or loss of function. Upon initial investigation this event appears to possibly be due to a problem in transcription however causes and corrective actions are still being evaluated."

INADVERTANT OPENING A SUBSTATION BREAKER CAUSING LOSS OF STATION POWER

"At 1549 on 03/10/2011 with the plant shut down and the reactor defueled, power was lost to Safeguards 4160 Volt Bus 6. Diesel Generator B started and re-energized Bus 6.

"At the time of the event, Bus 6 was energized from the Main Auxiliary Transformer (MAT) on backfeed. The event was caused by opening of substation breaker TA2066 as the result of an error by technicians working in the substation.

"All equipment operated as expected for the voltage restoration to Safeguards Bus 6. Safeguards Bus 5 remained energized from offsite power through the Tertiary Auxiliary Transformer during the event.

"Spent Fuel Pool Cooling Train A remained in operation during the event. Spent Fuel Cooling Train B was restarted following restoration of power to Bus 6.

"The loss of the MAT also resulted in the loss of non-safeguards 4160 V Buses 1-4. In response to the loss of power to Bus 4, the Technical Support Center (TSC) / Station Blackout (SBO) Diesel started and failed to load onto 480 Volt Bus 46. This resulted in a loss of power to the Technical Support Center. The loss of power to the TSC is being reported as a loss of Emergency Assessment Capability. At 1632, the TSC/SBO Diesel Generator tripped due to the failure of the output breaker to close and provide power to its support equipment. The cause of the failure of the TSC/SBO output breaker to close is unknown at this time."

The licensee is investigating the cause of the breaker being opened and failure of the TSC/SBO diesel to load. One Spent Fuel Pool cooling train was in service throughout the event and no pool heatup occurred.

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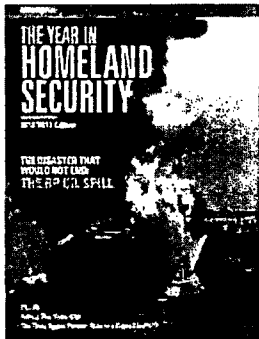

The Commission has approved the staff's recommended Option 1. The staff should evaluate current extended power uprate (EPU) applications, as well as future applications for new or increased credit for containment accident pressure (CAP), consistent with staff practice in implementing the current risk review guidance (Standard Review Plan Section 19.2), including the review of nonrisk-informed applications such as EPUs and the recently-developed deterministic guidance based on recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) to include uncertainty and margins in CAP calculations.

Because the statements in Regulatory Guide 1.174 are subject to different interpretations, the staff should revise this guide using precise language to assure that the defense-in-depth philosophy is interpreted and implemented consistently. To the extent that other regulatory guidance refers to defense in depth, the relevant documents should be updated also, as appropriate.

16 Mar 1621 First Formal Contact Between English Colonists and Native Americans

Samoset (ca. 1590 – 1653) was the first Native American to make contact with the Pilgrims. On March 16, 1621, the settlers were more than surprised when Samoset strolled straight through the middle of the encampment at Plymouth Colony and greeted them in English. He was a member of an Abenaki tribe that resided at that time in Maine. He was a sagamore (subordinate chief) of his tribe and was visiting Chief Massasoit. He had learned his broken English from the English fishermen that came to fish off Monhegan Island. After spending the night with the Pilgrims, he came back two days later with Squanto, who spoke English much better than Samoset.

The orthography of Samoset's name varied depending on which Englishman was discussing him. Although he appeared as Samoset in some accounts, in others he appeared as Somerset. This odd Anglicisation of this American Indian name probably came naturally to English explorers, many of whom hailed from the West Country. Even Captain Christopher Levett, a Yorkshireman, referred to this Native American as Somerset in his account of his journey to explore New England in 1623 and 1624.
