Dear Commission:

I am writing to you today to show support for PG&E's successful spent fuel management program and the NRC's Spent Fuel Storage Rule. As a fifth-generation resident and longtime farmer in the local area, I take immense pride in knowing PG&E is actively taking great care and precaution to keep us safe. Their site at Diablo Canyon is not only safe for residents, but for their workforce as well, and who employs 134 people whom live in my specific district and home town creating a huge economic impact on the community!

Again, I am in complete support of the NRC's Spent Fuel Storage Rule and have witnessed firsthand that with NRC oversight PG&E has a *very* detailed and successful spent fuel management program who continues to safely store fuel via both its wet and dry cask storage systems. Through my personal tour of the facility, I am confident that numerous safeguards are in place to manage and monitor the stored spent fuel. However, the Department of Energy has a responsibility to make good on its commitment to receive and safely store the spent fuel for the long term. By doing so, locally stored spent fuel could be safely removed to a single or regional locations controlled by AND protected by our national government until a cost effective way of recycling portions of the stored fuel can be determined and realized.
