Carl:

Given the overlap of the zip codes you described, I believe your current license is still suitable for this shipment. Continue to use the original zip code for this entity. Meanwhile, since your export license is being amended, I will interpret your email as a request to revise the zip code for this end-user. Such a minor change will not necessitate a restarting of the 30 day public comment period.

I just looked, and Day 30 of the public review process for PXB6.16 is on January 16, just a few days from now. If we can get the license to you soon thereafter, it may not even be an issue.

Hello Steve,

Happy New Year!

I was reviewing our current export license PXB6.15 for an upcoming project that will require the export of the Cat 1 Co-60 to Nordion. I found that the site (Rhode Island Hospital) had been on our Export License for some time and confirmed the address was the same. Today, I received the RML from the site and it appears this is a case of a zip code within a zip code that may have changed over the years. The Zip Code we have for Rhode Island Hospital on our Export License is 02902 and the Zip Code on the current RML has 02903. The address is identical and if you put both into a map they appear at the same location. Looking at <http://maps.huge.info/zip.htm> (Zip Code Finder) 02902 is within 02903.

With all that said, will we have to amend the license and put the project on hold until the amended license is received over this issue?
