Re: Aerotest and Nuclear Labyrinth Demands for Hearing (Docket No. 50-228, License No. R-98)

Dear Ms. Vietti-Cook:

Aerotest Operations, Inc. (“Aerotest”) and Nuclear Labyrinth, LLC (“Nuclear Labyrinth”) respectfully request the Commission to take action on their Demands for Hearing regarding the Aerotest Radiography and Research Reactor (“ARRR”).

By letter dated July 24, 2013, the NRC Staff denied Aerotest’s application to renew the ARRR operating license, denied Aerotest’s application to indirectly transfer the ARRR license to Nuclear Labyrinth, and issued an Order modifying the ARRR license to prohibit operation.¹ On August 13, 2013, Aerotest and Nuclear Labyrinth timely submitted: 1) Joint Answer to and Demand for Hearing on Order Prohibiting Operation of Aerotest Radiography and Research Reactor Facility Operating License No. R-98, and 2) Joint Demand for Hearing on Denial of License Renewal and Indirect License Transfer Regarding Aerotest Radiography and Research Reactor Facility Operating License No. R-98 (collectively “Demands for Hearing”).


On August 21, 2013, the NRC Staff moved to sever any hearing on the denial of the license renewal from a hearing on the denial of the indirect license transfer. Aerotest and Nuclear Labyrinth replied to this motion on August 29, 2013. The NRC Staff filed a response to the Joint Answer to and Demand for Hearing on Order Prohibiting

Operation of Aerotest Radiography and Research Reactor Facility Operating License No. R-98 on August 27, 2013. NRC Staff filed two answers to the Joint Demand for Hearing on Denial of License Renewal and Indirect License Transfer on September 9, 2013. The NRC Staff did not oppose Aerotest's and Nuclear Labyrinth's Demands for Hearing.

Other than notifying the parties of the suspension of the proceeding during the government shutdown and the lifting of the suspension, there has been no action on this docket since September 9, 2013. Aerotest and Nuclear Labyrinth request that the Commission review the filings and issue an Order scheduling the proceedings.
