Follow-up from the January 28, 2014, Public Meeting on CER

SUMMARY

During the January 28, 2014, public meeting on the Cumulative Effects of Regulation (CER), Adrian Heymer commented that the Nuclear Energy Institute's (NEI's) recommendations on regulatory analysis improvements (see industry handout available at ADAMS Accession No. ML14028A455) could be applied to the ongoing 10 CFR Part 74, Material Control and Accounting, rulemaking. To prepare for an upcoming public meeting on the Part 74 rule, Tara Inverso of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) called Mr. Heymer for more details on how NEI envisioned the recommendations could apply to the Part 74 rulemaking. The following items were discussed:

- Mr. Heymer noted that, during the most recent public meeting (January 2014) on the Part 74 rule, NEI described how the rule language was interpreted by the industry, which seemed to be different than what the NRC intended.
- Mr. Heymer noted that the second public meeting (planned for February 5, 2014) was a follow-on to that meeting to continue the conversation and continue to discuss the scope of the rule. A third meeting may be necessary to continue the conversation.
- NEI is going to provide comment on the draft regulatory analysis; better understanding of the scope will improve the comments.
- Ms. Inverso noted that it appeared as if the Part 74 rule was already incorporating some of NEI's lessons-learned from its case studies already. Mr. Heymer agreed and noted that the continued interactions would continue to address the lessons-learned.
