Dear Mrs. Maitz:

On February 25, 2014, an inspector from the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) conducted a routine inspection at your Royal Oak, Michigan facility, with continued in-office review through March 6, 2014. The purpose of the in-office review was to assess additional information not available during the onsite inspection. A final exit meeting was held between you, Mr. Bramnik of my staff, and your Corporate Radiation Safety Officer Mrs. Culver Shultz on March 6, 2014, to discuss the inspection findings.

During this inspection, the NRC staff examined activities conducted under your license related to public health and safety and security. Additionally, the staff examined your compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations as well as the conditions of your license. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selected examination of procedures and representative records, observations of activities, and interviews with personnel.

Based on the results of this inspection, the NRC has determined that one Severity Level IV violation of NRC requirements occurred. The violation was evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. The current Enforcement Policy is included on the NRC's website at <http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/enforce-pol.html>. The violation is of a security-related nature. Details of the violation are available in the enclosed non-public Inspection Record. Immediate corrective action for the violation has since been taken to restore compliance with NRC requirements. The violation is cited in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). The NRC is citing the violations in the Notice, because the inspector identified the violations.

The NRC has concluded that information regarding: (1) the reason for the violation; (2) the corrective actions that have been taken and the results achieved; and (3) the date when full compliance was achieved is already adequately addressed on the docket in the non-public

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Inspection Record. Therefore, you are not required to respond to this letter. However, you are required to submit a written statement or explanation pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) 2.201 if the description in the aforementioned correspondence does not accurately reflect your corrective actions or your position. In that case, or if you choose to provide additional information, you should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice.

Because this issue involves security-related information, if you choose to respond, your response will not be made available electronically for public inspection in the NRC's Public Document Room or from the NRC's Agencywide Document Access and Management System (ADAMS). Please mark the top of each page of your response "Security-Related Information – Withhold Under 10 CFR 2.390". To the extent possible, your response should not include any personal privacy, proprietary, or safeguards information.
