Also, is there any way to find out the batch number before the shipment? We are planning on supplementing the KI stockpile in San Luis Obispo due to population growth. We would like to attempt coordinating the expiration dates with the vendor. We will purchase KI for our institutionalized populations on the periphery of the EPZ as well. Coordinating our purchased KI expiration date to as close as we can get with the NRC provided KI will be helpful.

Hi Bill,

I understand your concerns regarding the expiration dates of the KI. The differing expiration dates came about as a result of multiple order dates for 130 mg tablets as well as 65 mg tablets and the tablets come from different manufacturers and have different shelf life and expiration dates.

NRC staff direction from the Commission in SRM-SECY-09-0041 directs the staff to replenish existing stockpiles consistent with the expiration dates of the tablets. Budget planning for upcoming years was

done based on this direction. Since California has two different expiration dates, the quantities to be replenished were assigned to the appropriate budget years. Due to the large amount of KI tablets that the NRC will be ordering and the recent price increases by the suppliers (due in part to new fees assigned by the Food and Drug Administration on generic drug makers), it is not possible for us to simply roll all of calendar year (CY)15 KI into CY14 or vice versa. I understand this is not a satisfying explanation; unfortunately it is the reality in which we find ourselves.

However, what we may be able to do is to coordinate the orders such that you could receive the replacements for CY14 at the very end of '14 (from fiscal year (FY) 14 and receive CY15 KI very early in the year (from FY15) I could not guarantee that they would be the same lot number or even the same expiration date, but likely the dates would be close enough to be essentially the same. The only caveat with this approach is the availability of funds early in a new fiscal year. As you know, the federal government seems to routinely operate under continuing resolutions for most of the budget year. This poses challenges to us as we attempt to allot monies to contracts. What this means is that despite our best efforts to closely coordinate the deliveries, the reality of a continuing resolution may get in the way. The only way to fix this problem of budget uncertainty and availability of funds is to have Congress agree on and pass a budget and the President to sign it well before the new FY starts.

We will try our best to make it work out for you. We want to support your efforts for effective distribution of KI. Another alternative, although likely not too desirable for your office, is for California to fund its own purchases of KI. If you did this you would have complete control over the expiration dates.

I wish we could do more.

The State of California will participate in the NRC potassium iodide (KI) tablet replenishment. We have a special request regarding the expiration dates for the KI and two separate locations for delivery of the KI.

Please provide all future KI with the same expiration date. It is cost prohibitive for pre-distribution of KI to the public when we have two expiration dates. We have KI that expires in both 2014 and 2015. Please coordinate your purchases so the State is provided all of its KI with the same singular future expiration date. Please contact me if you are unable to do so.

Please provide the replacement KI in the following quantities to the addresses listed. Have the deliveries coordinated with the listed points-of-contact so the shipments to ensure personnel will be available to accept the shipments.

The NRC is preparing to replenish expiring stockpiles of KI tablets. According to our records your State has 203,300 (65mg) tablets with lot numbers TU902B expiring in December 2014 and 260,200 (65mg) tablets with lot numbers TU902C expiring in December 2014. The NRC will replace the expiring stockpiles during fiscal year 2014. If your State wishes to participate in the NRC KI tablet replenishment, please respond with the delivery address, point of contact (including phone number) and any special delivery requests you have no later than May 31, 2013. Please note these tablets will not be shipped until 2014 to ensure timely replacement of your States expiring KI stockpiles. We will notify you prior to shipment of the tablets to enable you to make any preparations necessary for receipt of the shipment.
