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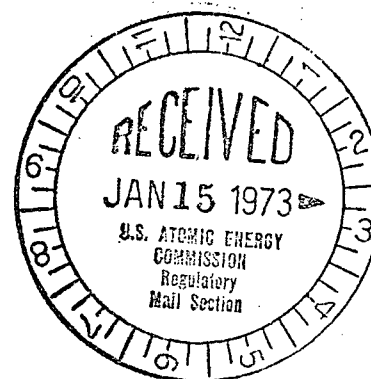

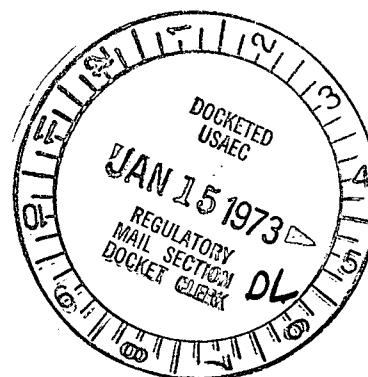
Dear Mr. Muller:

COMMENTS ON DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL STATEMENT FOR THE PROPOSED ONOFRE  
NUCLEAR GENERATING STATION, UNITS 2 AND 3 IN SAN DIEGO COUNTY

We find no conflict with any Soil Conservation Service on-going or planned programs or projects.

We would like to point out, however, that slope stabilization should be considered if similar site construction will be used on Units 2 and 3 as was used on Unit 1. Reference is made to Figures 3.1 to 3.8, and on page 3-9, where the bare slopes show some degree of erosion. We would suggest that consideration be given to some form of slope stabilization to prevent erosion.
