Background

- June 2000 SECY-00-145 Integrated Rulemaking Plan for Nuclear Power Plant Decommissioning
- Late 2012/2013 announcements that 5 nuclear generating units would enter the transition to decommissioning, with very little notice provided
- Since June, 2013 27 licensing exemptions filed, approximately 13 from units now in the decommissioning transition process
- Near-term possibility that more could be filed with the likely need for fast turn-around
- Regulatory framework and processes are not optimized, resulting in inefficiencies and undesirable and unnecessary resource impacts.





Objectives

- Develop a shared understanding, with the NRC, of the issues and possible resolution paths for plants currently in transition to decommissioning, with a clear focus on expedient review of submittals and efficient use of decommissioning funds and NRC resources.
- Establish a well-defined regulatory framework and related processes that assure adequate protection of health and safety throughout the transition from operation to decommissioning while minimizing inefficiencies and undesirable and unnecessary resource impacts.





Industry Task Force

 Monitor and share experiences of the lead plants and identify and apply lessons learned

Near Term

- Interact with NRC staff in public forum to:
 - Discuss the ongoing applicability of existing regulatory requirements and guidance
 - Provide suggestions to NRC staff that may help clarify and inform policy and regulatory bases for NRC decisions
 - Suggest ideas for enhancing the regulatory framework and processes

Longer Term

Develop industry guidance for NRC endorsement





Areas of Current Licensee Concerns

- Time frame for regulatory review of licensee submitted materials
- Regulatory Process and Applicability
 - Emergency Preparedness
 - Security (Cyber and Physical)
 - Licensed Senior Operators







Decommissioning Transition Priority Timeline

- Priority of resolution should address the lower risk (i.e. with core off-loaded)/ higher impact issues first
 - Emergency Preparedness
 - Security (Cyber and Physical)
 - Licensed Senior Operators





Next Steps

- Continue ongoing dialogue with NRC staff.
- Periodic Task Force interactions with NRC
- Develop shared understanding and regulatory certainty relative to the following areas of concern:

Priority 1: "Emergency Preparedness" Resolution

Target: June, 2014

Priority 2: "Security" Resolution Target: August, 2014

Priority 3: "Senior Licensed Operators" Resolution

Target: October, 2014





Long Term Actions

 Continue development of an industry guidance document for the overall decommissioning transition process and attain NRC endorsement.

Draft Completion Target: October 31, 2014.
