I need this information by January 6, 1973.

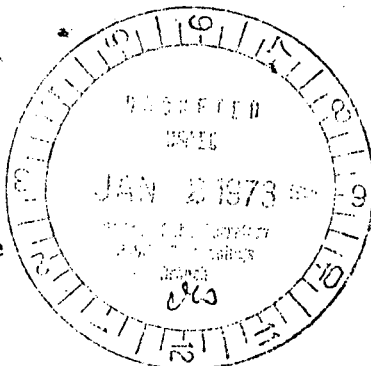
