I have just read Jim's e-mail concerning the pacemaker license issued to John McKay and our actions to determine the proper disposition of the device. Since the license is expired, I do not believe that Sheryl can open a licensing action to terminate the license. According to our procedures and in the "How-to" document, an expired license is retired. A letter to the licensee, in this case the widow, is drafted detailing our basis for retiring the license. We can draft the letter separately or make it part of the inspection documentation. A License Status Change Sheet must be submitted to LAT to close out the retirement.

Sheryl,

Using this email, please administratively open a license termination action for licensee – John McKay – License No. SNM-2012 – Docket No. 070-07017.

The license expired on March 31, 2013. In advance of the license expiration Steve Courtemanche tried to contact the licensee and succeeded in reaching his widow on March 12, 2013. Mrs. McKay stated that her husband had died, the nuclear pacemaker had been explanted, and the nuclear pacemaker had been returned to the manufacturer. Mrs. McKay promised to send a request for license termination. Steve sent letters reminding her of her promise to submit a request for license termination but apparently we never received anything.

We recently determined, while preparing for inspection, that the license had expired. Bob Gallagher contacted the nuclear pacemaker's representative and confirmed the device had been properly returned. Our licensee no longer exists. A letter requesting termination from his wife is not important. We need to terminate the license.
