Dear Mr. Pacilio:

On March 14, 2014, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) completed a security inspection at your Dresden Nuclear Power Station, Units 2 and 3, and discussed the results of this inspection with Mr. S. Marik and other members of your staff. Inspector documented the results of this inspection in the enclosed inspection report.

The inspection examined activities conducted under your license as they relate to public health and safety, the common defense and security, and to confirm compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and with the conditions of your license. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selected examination of procedures and representative records, observations of activities, and interviews with personnel.

The NRC inspector documented one finding of very low security significance (Green) in this report. This finding involved a violation of NRC requirements. A cross-cutting aspect was assigned to this finding in the area of Human Performance – Training [H.9] because the licensee failed to recognize that a newly created document needed to be controlled as Safeguards information. This deficiency was promptly corrected or compensated for, and the plant was in compliance with applicable physical protection and security requirements within the scope of this inspection before the inspector left the site. In addition, the inspector documented a licensee-identified violation which was determined to be Severity Level IV in this report. The NRC is treating these violations as Non-Cited Violations (NCVs) consistent with Section 2.3.2.a of the Enforcement Policy.

If you contest the violations or significance of these NCVs and/or if you disagree with a cross-cutting aspect assignment in this report, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your denial and/or disagreement, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington DC 20555-0001; with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region III; the Director, Office of Enforcement, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555-0001; and the NRC resident inspector at the Dresden Nuclear Power Station.
