Dear Mr. Mulligan:

On January 24, 2014, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) completed its initial assessment of the circumstances surrounding the security event which occurred on January 15, 2014, at the Grand Gulf Nuclear Station, Unit 1. Based on this initial assessment, the NRC sent an inspection team on February 3, 2014.

On March 25, 2014, the NRC completed its reactive inspection and on March 28, the NRC inspection team discussed the results of this inspection telephonically with Mr. T. Coutu, Director, Regulatory and Performance Improvement. The inspection team documented the results of this inspection in the enclosed inspection report.

NRC inspectors documented one finding of very low safety significance (Green) in this report. This finding involved a violation of NRC requirements. The NRC is treating this violation as a non-cited violation (NCV) consistent with Section 2.3.2.a, of the Enforcement Policy.

If you contest the violation or significance of this NCV, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your denial, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington DC 20555-0001; with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region IV; the Director, Office of Enforcement, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555-0001; and the NRC resident inspector at the Grand Gulf Nuclear Station.

One cross-cutting aspect was assigned to the finding in the area of human performance because management personnel were not commonly seen in the work areas of the plant observing, coaching, and reinforcing standards and expectations. This resulted in deviations from standards and expectations thus preventing the prompt correction of these behaviors [H.2].

If you disagree with the cross-cutting aspect assignment in this report, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your

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disagreement, to the Regional Administrator, Region IV; and the NRC resident inspector at the Grand Gulf Nuclear Station.

In accordance with Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations, (10 CFR) 2.390, "Public Inspections, Exemptions, Requests for Withholding," of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the Publicly Available Records (PARS) component of NRC's Agency wide Document Access and Management System (ADAMS). ADAMS is accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html> (the Public Electronic Reading Room).

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390(b)(1)(ii), the NRC is waiving the affidavit requirements for your response.
