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DISCUSSION OF LESSONS LEARNED SHORT TERM REQUIREMENTS

Dear Mr. Denton:

In your letter of October 30, 1979, to all operating nuclear power plants, you provided clarifications of the "short term" requirements addressed in Mr. D. G. Eisenhower's letter of September 13, 1979. You also requested that within 15 days of receipt of your letter, we identify any disagreements with the staff requirements and provide revised schedules for any items that we had previously identified as not meeting the established implementation dates. In response to this request, we have conducted a review of the items associated with our H. B. Robinson Unit No. 2 Plant. We were aided in this effort by a telephone conversation with members of your staff on November 8, in which certain schedule deficiencies or items requiring further clarifications were identified.

The results of our review are presented in the following discussion on an item by item basis, where necessary. In general, our proposed methods for resolving the items are in accord with the requirements you have provided to us; this does not imply, however, that we necessarily agree with all of your requirements.

In our letter of October 18 to Mr. D. G. Eisenhower, we identified a slight deviation from the intended implementation of Item 2.1.6.b - Shielding Review. We presently believe that it may be possible to complete the full review required by January 1, 1980, but cannot assure it at this point. We are working diligently in this area with the assistance of a number of contractor personnel, and are putting forth a best effort to complete implementation. At this point, with six weeks still left to work on this item, it is too early to determine if the schedule can be improved to the point where all required areas in the plant have been reviewed. As the implementation date of January 1, 1980, approaches, we will contact your staff if a problem in meeting the date exists.

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The other items discussed in our telephone conversation with your staff were as follows: 2.1.1, 2.1.3.a, 2.1.3.b, 2.1.6.a, 2.1.8.c, 2.2.2.b and Containment Water Level Indication. Details of the method of implementation for these items and the other items requiring implementation by January 1, 1980, will be provided in a submittal to you by December 31, 1979, as agreed to by your staff. As stated in our submittal of October 18, 1979, CP&L intends to fully meet the requirements specified in D. G. Eisenhower's letter of September 13, 1979. Our December 31 submittal will document that implementation, including the requirements specified in your letter of October 30, 1979.

We trust this information is suitable for your use.
