ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGES

SUMMARY

In accordance with the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 10, Parts 50.90 and Part 2.101, Carolina Power & Light Company (CP&L) hereby requests revisions to the Technical Specifications (TS) for the H. B. Robinson Steam Electric Plant Unit No. 2 (HBR2). These revisions are as a result of a recent reorganization at CP&L.

DETAILS

In August 1983, CP&L announced a major reorganization of the Power Supply and Engineering & Construction groups. The requested revisions make the HBR2 TS consistent with CP&L's present organizational structure. In addition, Figure 6.2-2 has been revised to include the security group at HBR2. This group was in place and functional prior to the recent reorganization, but was never included in the TS. The operating organization on Figure 6.2-2 has also been revised to meet the requirements of 10CFR50.54(m)(2). This revision to the text of the TS was requested by CP&L letter dated October 14, 1983. The revision to the Figure was delayed to this request so that all of the organizational changes to the Figure could be made at one time.

SIGNIFICANT HAZARDS DETERMINATION

Carolina Power & Light Company has reviewed this request and has determined that the proposed TS revisions involve no significant hazards considerations because the proposed changes make the TS consistent with the current CP&L organizational structure. The Commission has provided guidance concerning the application of its standards set forth in 10CFR50.92 for no significant hazards considerations by providing certain examples published in the Federal Register on April 6, 1983 (48 FR 14864). One of the examples of

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an amendment which will likely be found to involve no significant hazards considerations is a purely administrative change to the TS; for example, a change to achieve consistency throughout the TS, correction of an error, or a change in nomenclature. The attached proposed changes fall within the Commission's example (i) of a change not likely to involve a significant hazards consideration.

ADMINISTRATIVE

These revisions represent a single Class II Amendment as defined in 10CFR170.22, and require a \$1,200 fee. A check for that amount is attached accordingly.
