SUMMARY

In accordance with the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 10, Part 50.90 and Part 2.101, Carolina Power & Light Company (CP&L) hereby requests revisions to the Technical Specifications (TS) for the H. B. Robinson Steam Electric Plant Unit No. 2 (HBR2). These revisions supplement the Radiological Effluent Technical Specifications (RETS) which were submitted to you by letter dated October 25, 1983.

DETAILS

The attached RETS revisions incorporate the comments of your staff which were discussed in a telephone call on December 15, 1983. In addition, a reference section has been updated and a new section 3.5.1.4 has been added to require containment isolation only when containment integrity is required, as discussed with your staff. Please replace the pages in our October 25, 1983 submittal with those attached (3.5-1, 3.5-9, 3.5-11, 3.9-3, 3.9-5, 4.10-3, and 4.10-8).

ADMINISTRATIVE

The revised proposed RETS pages are attached. Changes are denoted by vertical bars in the right-hand margin. Since these revisions have been requested by your staff and this is a supplement to our previous submittals, CP&L has determined that no license amendment application fee is required.

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IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE

In order to allow sufficient time to prepare new procedures and necessary procedural revisions to incorporate the requirements identified in the RETS, the Offsite Dose Calculation Manual (ODCM), and the Process Control Program (PCP), CP&L plans to implement these controls and procedures within nine months following approval of the RETS, ODCM, and PCP. As stated in our letters of February 7, 1983 and October 25, 1983, because of the interrelationships of these three documents, they cannot be implemented separately; therefore, the nine-month schedule will begin following your approval of the last of the three documents. However, CP&L would also require the flexibility to phase the implementation. For example, some of the procedures may be implemented several months before the end of the nine-month interval. Therefore, CP&L requests that the implementation requirements when the RETS are issued be stated to allow a phased implementation, not to exceed nine months after the approval of the last of the three documents.
