Activity: License renewal would involve continued maintenance and operation activities within developed or previously disturbed areas of the LGS site, and continued operation and maintenance of the Perkiomen Pumphouse, Bradshaw Reservoir and Pumphouse, and the Bedminster Water Processing Facility.

ESSENTIAL FISH HABITAT (EFH)

Project may adversely affect EFH.

ESSENTIAL FISH HABITAT CONSERVATION RECOMMENDATIONS

(Note: EFH conservation recommendations (CRs) require a response from the federal action agency within 30 days of receipt or 10 days before a permit is issued if CRs are not included as a special condition of the permit.)

Avoid in-water maintenance work from March 1 to June 30 of each year to minimize adverse effects on migrating and spawning activities of anadromous fish.

FISH AND WILDLIFE COORDINATION ACT COMMENTS

ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT

Threatened and endangered species under the jurisdiction of NOAA Fisheries, including Atlantic sturgeon and shortnose sturgeon, may be present in the project area. Consultation with the Protected Resources Division may be required.
