Good Morning Chris

I wanted to let you know that I am proceeding with the acceptance review of the document you sent in outlining WNI position on, and request for, the termination of the license for the Split Rock site. However, our Public Document Room has informed me that the memorandum you provided was not submitted to them in accordance with NRC's requirements. Per your response below when I asked you about this, you stated that the version that was delivered to us by courier on 8/9/2014 was a courtesy copy and the impression is that the official submission was to the Document Control Desk.

Please find attached to this transmission the memorandum that Western Nuclear, Inc. (WNI) has prepared regarding its request that United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Staff terminate NRC License No. SUA-56 for its former conventional uranium mill facility at the Split Rock site in Jeffrey City, Wyoming. As we have discussed previously, WNI is requesting that NRC Staff move forward with termination of its license based on the complete suite of approvals issued by NRC Staff and the Commission. As discussed at our recent sidebar meeting, you informed us that you would complete an acceptance review of the memorandum before moving forward with the requested action. WNI respectfully requests that NRC Staff immediately contact its counsel, Christopher S. Pugsley, upon completion of this review to inform WNI if any additional documentation or information is required to help move this requested action forward. WNI thanks NRC Staff for the continued interaction on this matter and looks forward to assisting the Staff in the process forward. WNI also requests that upon satisfactory completion of the acceptance review that a public meeting be scheduled to develop and implement a timeline with a clear path forward to completing all work with the United States Department of Energy (DOE) and the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) for real property transfers and final Criterion 10 costing. Thank you for your time and consideration in this matter and a hard copy of the attached memorandum will be arriving via messenger today. The attachments are too large for one email so a second email will follow.
