**NRC STAFF'S RESPONSE TO OGLALA SIOUX TRIBE'S
AUGUST 16, 2014 MOTION**

On August 16, 2014, the Oglala Sioux Tribe moved for the Board to compel Powertech to disclose the following documents:

- (1) documents containing borehole data referenced in Powertech's August 7, 2014 e-mail to the Board;
- (2) a take permit application that Powertech submitted to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in January 2014; and
- (3) correspondence with the U.S. Bureau of Land Management (BLM), including a July 8, 2014 letter from BLM requesting additional information on Powertech's Plan of Operations and any Powertech responses to the letter

During the recent oral hearing, counsel for Powertech stipulated that his client would make all borehole data in Powertech's possession available for review by the Oglala Sioux Tribe and the Consolidated Intervenor¹. Based on this stipulation, it is the Staff's understanding that the first disclosure issue the Tribe identified in its motion has been resolved.

Regarding the second and third issues, the Staff believes the disclosure issues could be resolved quickly if Powertech submits the specified documents for *in camera* review by the

Board. The Board can then determine whether, as the Tribe claims, the documents are relevant to any of the issues within admitted contentions 1A, 2, 3, 4, or 6.²
